THE RETURN OF THE RED SQUIRREL



Staff from the Saving Scotland's Red Squirrels (SSRS) project are appealing to readers of the Belhelvie Banter to help with their important work. Over the summer SSRS carried out surveys for red and grey squirrels across a huge area, including around Belhelvie.

Numerous woodlands were surveyed across the wider Aberdeenshire countryside.

Project Officer Stephen Willis said, "We wanted to get a clearer picture of where red squirrels were still to be found. We have a reasonable number of records from the public but we need to survey every wood in any given area."

The survey involves a simple but effective method. Squirrels can be surprisingly elusive, so it's not just as simple as going to look for them. The project places small wooden boxes in the woods. They are filled with tempting treats and have a mesh front so that animals can smell the food inside. The only way in though, is for an animal to lift the lid of the box. As it is only mammals that manage this it is a great way to survey for squirrels. As the squirrels feeds away it brushes its back against a small sticky pad inside the lid. This collects hair samples that can be identified as red squirrel, grey squirrel, pine marten or mouse when viewed under a microscope.

Red squirrels are found throughout the area- we know of them at Grandhome and Parkhill and in woods around Newmachar. They are not alone though, as the non-native grey squirrel is found in many of the same woods. SSRS found grey squirrels in woods near Potterton, but need to know if they are found in other areas as well. Can you help?

As SSRS enters its third phase, our work in Scotland's northeast will continue to focus on targeted and co-ordinated trapping of grey squirrels. Trapping figures were encouraging last year, helped in large part by members of the public hosting a trap in their garden. This trap loan scheme has been a great success for the project. Nearly 300 households across the region have participated at one time or another, and it has made a real difference.

With an increase in our trapping coverage we have seen some extremely encouraging results. At Hazlehead Park on the edge of the City, which used to be home to a huge grey squirrel population, we are seeing signs of the red squirrel population recovering. One of the project's Grey Squirrel Control Officers has even started catching red squirrels in our traps for the very first time. The reds were all released unharmed. Many people who have hosted traps on our behalf have started to see reds back in their gardens now too, often after an absence of many years.



As the gardening year draws to a close, we have been busying ourselves indoors at the polytunnel, saving plants to overwinter indoors, and generally tidying up and putting things in order for a new season. The planters around the village are still looking good, in their mellow autumn colours, but very soon we will be clearing them out to plant up for the winter with the next delivery of plants kindly donated by the Council. We are, as always, enormously grateful for this continuing resource. As we near Armistice Day on 11th November, we are pleased to have been able, in this particular commemorative year, to have worked on our 'poppy' planter (with its 'Lest we forget' inscription) opposite the Chapelwell development, on Eigie Road.

Litter picks by the Better Balmedie group and friends are ongoing. We organised one around the village on the 1st November. Eighteen people took part and between us, we collected four wheelie bins of litter and household waste in just over an hour. Our village orderly does a great job all year round, but it's good if we can all give her a helping hand. The blue-lidded recycling bins do seem to be making a difference, but there are still many dog poo bags left lying or hanging on bushes. Most folk do dispose responsibly, let's make it 100%.

Upcoming litter picks are usually well advertised; so do keep a lookout for the next one. You would be very welcome and we have all the necessary equipment to keep you clean and hygienic!

On the whole, support from the village has continued to be most heartening, and for that we thank you all. A particularly big thank-you must go this time round to our local Co-operative store. Not only has it co-funded our next bench, for shoppers (and others) to rest their weary limbs, but in addition, our group has recently been the grateful recipient of a £500 donation from the shop. Perhaps you spotted a photo in the local press of the occasion where we, along with the Christmas Lights Group were handed these most appreciated donations? Thank you indeed!

We will continue to meet monthly over the winter, at 7.30p.m. in the library, on the last Thursday of the month. Our AGM took place on 30th October, when activities over the winter were planned – so watch this space! We also meet in the polytunnel on Wednesday and Saturday mornings, from 10 o'clock until midday. Newcomers to the group, and visitors, are always most welcome, so if you would like to find out what we do, feel free to drop by! (The polytunnel is situated behind the Leisure Centre).

PARISH THREADS

The Future is Exciting

Someone told us they'd heard that years ago an Owl flew into our kitchen and perched above the fireplace. It sounds like a children's story doesn't it? 'The Owl who lived on the Mantle-piece'... Maybe it really happened. It's true there are Owls in the garden here. We have seen young ones hopping around the lawn on summer evenings and they do seem less orientated. I could imagine one dark night the door could have been left open and in the morning when the family got up there he was, blinking over the Rayburn.

I try not to be nostalgic for a time when we knew less about the world. Constantly being reminded of great changes can be wearing. Even having to adapt to small changes is tiresome. It can feel like the very earth is shifting. Take the missing Linda for instance. Linda has been at the Belhelvie quarry office more or less in charge of things as long as we can remember. A reliable part of parish life. This year when we went to fetch our usual ton of sub-base she wasn't there. Gone. There was a man in her chair to and in front of him on the desk was this helpful sign: 'Still not Linda'.

Over in Africa we hear the ancient handshake greeting has been changed to a hand over the heart gesture in an effort to stop the spread of the Ebola virus. How very touching is that act of un-touching.

Our traditional greeting: Hello from 'Halloo!' the old call from the hunting field, only arrived with the telephone (in the thirties here at Ardo). The new technology provoked this startled call that was used to urge on the hounds. I think when the phone rang it felt as if the outside world might have been about to intrude or when calling, your voice was in danger of going off who knew where. I still feel a bit like that with our current telephone and broadband issues. Our signal comes and goes. 'Hello... goodbye...hello'. Video clips of dogs or dolphins on social media sites come in uninvited to gobble up our gigabytes.

Work on the long awaited bypass has begun in the parish. Trees are being felled and land cleared. The sandy south of the parish will be re-landscaped. Men wearing more layers than an onion are directing traffic with their 'Go' and 'Stop' lollypops. Lorries are carrying stone hither and thither. The land is being cut to the bone. It's no use me pursing my lemon lips in my ivory tower though because easier road access to cities is needed; at the very least so someone can come and fix our wi-fi problems. Commerce is important, it's the way forward.

That reminds me of a story about commerce that could have been set here in Belhelvie. Once upon a time three men called Bat, Bramble and Cormorant were in the wool business together. They borrowed money to invest in a ship to export the woollen cloth to... Edinburgh, let's say.

Unfortunately the ship sank...on the sand bank off Balmedie I shouldn't wonder... ruining all three of the businessmen. Which is why, the Bat, to avoid his creditors, only comes out at night, the Cormorant is always diving to salvage the wreck and the Bramble snatches wool wherever it can.

It was a long way to Edinburgh by road then; quicker by a ship (although they had to avoid the sandbanks). Fifty years ago this summer the road bridge over the Forth was opened to make the journey easier. Our neighbour Jeremy from East Cannahars says he watched the bridge construction from the ferry when he travelled to school in Edinburgh. Before 1890 when the rail bridge was opened, Edinburgh would have been a mere folk tale for people living here in Belhelvie. Everyone had to make do with the parish for entertainment... such as misplaced birdlife.

The poet Wallace Stevens said:

"A man and a woman are one.

A man and a woman and a Blackbird are one."

I like that don't you?

Here's to a healthy heart and a wet glass.

Landfill Tax. Local Environmental Projects


Progress is on-going regarding community projects which will be financed largely through landfill tax payments claimed from the Easter Hatton landfill site. Aberdeenshire Environmental Forum are progressing the registration of applications to Entrust and it is hoped that all viable projects will be registered by the end of November.

There are now 12 projects being considered, and these comprise: 2 seven-a-side football pitches at Balmedie links; the upgrade of Belhelvie football and play area; the upgrade of Potterton football pitch; 600 square metres of wildflowers at Scott Terrace, Belhelvie; 1,900 square metres of wildflowers at Panmure Gardens, Potterton; 350 square metres of wildflowers at Blackdog Football and Leisure Park plus gardening equipment; sowing of wildflowers at Balmedie Magnificent 7 Woods and the repair of the dry stone dyke; the creation of a sensory garden in Balmedie; creation of energy efficiency projects at Balmedie Leisure Centre; creation of car park and path at Tarts & Crafts; installation of finger signposts in Balmedie.

These works entail extensive planning and research and we appreciate the on-going support and co-operation we have received from Aberdeenshire Council (Ellon Area Office) and Taylor Environmental, Easter Hatton Landfill Site.

A further update will be made available in the next issue of 'Belhelvie Banter'.

CHRISTMAS AT BELHELVIE CHURCH

I start this article with a picture of the Best Christmas Present Ever....



At the age of nine, I'd set my heart on a Raleigh Chopper when I saw my friend Alan Scott zooming about on one in the local park. In the era before iphones and X-boxes, a Chopper was the present we were all desperate to have.

I dropped a few hints to my mum, never really thinking that she'd pick up on them for I knew Choppers were dear and I didn't think it'd be a realistic option. But there, leaning against the sofa on

Christmas morning, was a fire-red Raleigh Chopper. I couldn't have been happier. The best present ever!

It was a mild Christmas Day and I was really keen to have a shot of the new bike so my dad took me down to the local park to have a go and while we were there, something happened that I'll never forget.

My dad contracted polio when he was just six, and since then he's had to wear a metal calliper on his right leg to allow him to walk. This was just an unspoken fact of life in our house and he never let it hold him back; but his disability did limit what he was able to do with us – no hillwalking, no football and no cycling.

But not that day! I couldn't quite believe it when he asked me if he could have a turn. He threw his good leg over the bike, unlocked his calliper so it could bend, and set off on his way down the path, wobbling and grinning like a loon. I'd never seen him ride a bike before and I've never seen him do it since. I know now that as a thrawn wee boy with polio, he was determined to try and do what the others were doing, even if it meant more spills than thrills, and he stuck at it until he learned how to keep his balance. So he could cycle – I'd just never seen him do it.

When I look back at that wee episode in my life, it stands out to me as a time when my dad entered my world in a way that took me completely by surprise. Why did he do it? I'm guessing it was because he wanted to share my happiness and be a part of it.

I relive that story every Christmas because, for me, it's a vivid, personal picture of what I think the first Christmas was about – God entering our world, becoming one with us, in a way that we could never have imagined. Breaking through all kinds of barriers just to be with us. That's the God who's at the centre of our Christmas festivities.

There's a lot going on in our church in the build up to Christmas and we hope to see many of you come along over the next couple of months, but in the meantime can I wish you and yours every blessing for the Season and all the best for 2015.

BELHELVIE CHURCH'S RIGHT CHRISTMAS CAMPAIGN

Since 2007 our Right Christmas campaign has raised over £30k to give away to projects working with people in need. We've supported an educational project in Bangladesh, an orphan-rescue project in Kenya and a maternity hospital in Malawi.
