EDITORIAL



It's exciting to see the continual progress of the Aberdeen Western Peripheral Route in our area. To glide through parts of the countryside

that previously were fields is quite a novelty for now. Particularly pleasing is the attention that has been given to the resurrection and building of drystane dykes, heralding the revival of what was a disappearing skill. The creation of wild flower embankments is also a nice touch.

More concerning for Black Dog residents though, is the situation concerning bus stops. Their nearest, and only bus stops on routes to and from Aberdeen lie either side of the AWPR on the slip roads which is a fair distance from their actual village. This has made travelling on public transport impossible for many Blackdog residents who are unable to walk to and from the bus stops. We hope this situation will be resolved soon, for it is unacceptable that no buses enter the village.

The grapevine suggests that Stagecoach representatives, the operators of this bus route (at the time of Banter going to press) have not yet agreed to a definite meeting with Aberdeenshire councillors who are pushing to resolve this matter.

Bus companies have many considerations. The argument may be that it is not financially viable for the bus company, that passengers enroute for further north destinations will object to the extra time that a Blackdog detour will take. However, this is calculated to be all of 3 minutes. It sounds like a case of Watch This Space, but hopefully Stagecoach will reconsider and establish a Black Dog bus route that will truly serve the residents, their customers.

For the moment, Balmedie residents seem to have benefitted from additional bus services into the village. I enquired at Aberdeen bus station about which buses went into Balmedie and was told "All buses going north go into Balmedie, except ones with 'X' with the number". Seeing a northbound bus displaying an 'X" waiting to leave, I boarded and asked if it would be going into Balmedie and was told that it did. And much to my surprise, it did. So the lesson here is perhaps to check... and check again. Change does tend to bring confusion.

Stagecoach has detailed the increased services through Balmedie in their current printed Travel Guide, which states that the information contained is correct at the time of print. It doesn't state the duration of this service though. The perhaps over-optimistic thought is that Balmedie residents will hang on to this increased service for the foreseeable future. Too good to be true comes to my cynical mind.

To avoid too much confusion, there is a simplified bus timetable for the Aberdeen to Balmedie routes on page 61 (sorry - lack of space prevents inclusion of other services within the parish). You may need strong reading specs though!. Hopefully we will hear good news soon about improvements to the Blackdog bus services. Whatever route you find yourself on this autumn, I hope you enjoy whatever comes your way.

BILL DEANS MBE

Belhelvie resident, and lifeboat operations manager at Aberdeen Lifeboat Station, Bill Deans has reason to celebrate. In recognition of his 42 years' service to the Royal National Lifeboat Institution, he has recently been appointed MBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours List.

As a young police constable, Bill began volunteering as а crewmember on Aberdeen's Inshore Lifeboat in 1976 and on his retirement from the Police in 2002. took RNLI staff he up an

appointment as Divisional Trainer and Assessor. In this role he supported RNLI crews in Scotland and Ireland for 15 years.

Bill's interest in the RNLI was inspired during visits to Stronsay, Orkney where his mother's family roots lay. He was born in Aberdeen but Belhelvie is now his home, where he lives with his wife Pat, his two children now grown.

A veteran of more than 634 rescues, Bill retired from active crew service at the age of 60 in 2010, in line with RNLI policy. He immediately began volunteering as a Deputy Launching Authority and in 2015, he was invited to take up his present role as Lifeboat Operations Manager at Aberdeen Lifeboat Station.

Dr Margaret Farquhar CBE, former Lord Provost of Aberdeen and chair of the Aberdeen Branch of the RNLI, commented, "Bill Deans has led, trained and inspired generations of lifeboat crews, not just in Aberdeen but across Scotland and Ireland".

Congratulations Bill – we are delighted to hear that all your hard work over the years has been recognised.



PARISH THREADS

"I discovered windows one afternoon and after that, nothing was ever the same." Anne Spollen, "The Shape of Water"

"It's a circus out there." I say as we look out at the garden over breakfast. Sure enough we see the jackdaws doing their wobbly clown walk across the lawn while above them swallows are flying trapeze style, carving long curves in the air. Rooks jeer from the cheap seats but all are keeping an eye on the prowling ringmaster cat ushered in by the wren's whip crack alarm. During the lovely weather, so unusual in our Belhelvie world I have been cleaning my windows inside and outside. I have evicted surprised spiders and removed dusty webs that were holding onto the long dead husks of their relations. Later glancing towards the light my peripheral vision recorded nothing between the room and the outside. For half a second it relayed the message. 'Oh no, the glass has been stolen!' You could almost hear spiders tittering from their hidden corners. The house paintwork has been really dry for the first time in years and so gaps have opened up. We needed more putty but B&Q had run out. ' It must be the weather.' I said. The young assistant looked puzzled, too young to know that when the weather's this good it's time to get puttying and painting and window cleaning.

Of course there is always a dark side and the farmers who harvested good hay in June are now having to feed it back to their cattle before August. Cracks have opened up in Belhelvie fields and I even saw a dust devil pass through the yard. The hens are very happy though, they have had the best baths in the dry earth.

Are we all getting used to the sight of the wind-turbines in the bay? They went up so quickly they were a surprise even though we knew they were coming and then for a few weeks they weren't turning. Someone joked that they were fake ones made of cardboard ready for Donald Trump's visit. They have given me the job of editing my Octopus and a Mermaid stories. At no time does Sandy the octopus remark to Meridith that there are wind turbines just off shore from the Sand Bothy. When we have tired of new sights there is still that corner of the River Don that floods, where cattle still amble along the sloping earth bank and drink from the river as they have for hundreds of years. Driving past into Kintore one day the river was mirror flat. The brown and white cattle were perfectly reflected standing in the shallows as if they were in a Dutch oil painting.

There are more historic images over at the new Garioch Heritage Centre. The Diaspora Tapestry has been on show there for the summer (see photograph). Stories from 34 countries have been sewn into 305 panels like so many windows onto the history of the emigrating Scots people. Driving back from Inverurie along the brand new road towards Belhelvie we admired the fresh panoramic view of the parish those emigrants could never have imagined. Our old friend the Haar was hanging

just off shore at the height of the new wind farm. The top blades were sticking out of the bank of cloud like so many giant fiddle bows. Perhaps they were heralding the



North Atlantic Fiddle Convention that was held across Aberdeenshire in July. In the old Canadian Hall at Haddo we watched a three part orchestral work about the Scots from Ullapool who emigrated first to Canada and then to New Zealand in the 1800s. The 'SCAT' (Scottish Culture and Traditions) group played their socks off and the music reverberated up into the Douglas Fir rafters. Forgive mv panglossian view but I was so encouraged to hear sounds of harmony, inclusion and positivity in these times of European division and all the wider political shenanigans.



THE BELHELVIE GRAND PRIX!

As a longstanding resident of Belhelvie Village, I await with eager anticipation a quieter community following the full opening of the new AWPR. However, it remains to be seen how significantly the new Aberdeen by-pass road will influence the traffic travelling through the village.

Yes, I think the volume of traffic will be less (hopefully), but the real disturbance, annoyance, fearfulness and concern is that the speed of traffic entering and exiting Belhelvie from all directions will not reduce. Belhelvie has many residential and business properties on the roadside, and many of us have to reverse park our cars in our driveways, or emerge from lanes onto the road. We constantly have to bear the brunt of irritated passing drivers because we have dared to slow them down, by carrying out our manoeuvres at our homes and premises. Local children, cats and dogs, occasionally chickens and all wild life are not safe from the aspiring 'Fittipaldis' and 'Alonsos'. A neighbour recalls a time when his dog was able to sleep on the road near the junction in the village!

Recently (July 2018), I wrote a letter to the Local Authorities, complaining about the speed of traffic through Belhelvie, and I thank all of you who signed your support to my letter. I apologise to the rest of you in the village, who I did not get round to, as I tended to concentrate my efforts on those of us closest to the through roads. Current speed restriction signage lacks the impact that it could have. Many other small villages in Aberdeenshire have electronic signs, which would impose greater awareness. White lines on the road and at the 'STOP' sign have all but worn away now, inviting the non-stop driver to, well..., not stop!

Without wanting to sound too reprimanding, all I, or should I say WE, the supporting residents, ask really, is that car and lorry drivers entering the village anticipate the movements and activities of the residents and businesses, by slowing down appropriately with calm consideration. Hopefully the Authorities will come up with some better traffic calming solutions for us too.




Potterton Picnic in the Park

NATURAL BELHELVIE

Hello all, I trust that none of you forgot the Factor 100 during the wonderful summer? With the children back at school, time will fly and all too soon they will be practising for the Christmas Show. With the great weather, there has been no excuse for all of you to get out and forsake the telly, and there has and still is so much fascinating wildlife to see and hear.



Along the shore the terns will still be chattering busily as they fly along in search of a meal or two or three. With young to feed and of course themselves, it is busy busy. They are partial to sand eels, a small silvery fish that does look 'eel-like' but is really a fish! Confused, well the terns will not be, and indeed sand eels are the main food of many seabirds from puffins to guillemots. Sand eels occur in huge numbers in great

shoals, and often come close into the shore so that birds do not have far to carry them back for their bairns. Oh yes, puffins. Well a wee bit beyond the reach of Banterland, but if you want to see them at a spectacular place, then take a short drive up to the Bullers of Buchan. The terns, however, are all along the coast from Aberdeen north. They breed next to the Ythan Estuary near Newburgh. If you are getting the sand out of your sandwiches at Balmedie, you will see them diving for food. If you watch them closely you may notice that having dived headfirst and emerging, they frequently shake their body very fast. It is a bit odd for a bird that gets wet on a regular basis, but unlike ducks, terns do not have waterproofing on their feathers. Hence when they do get wet, they do the 'doggy shake' and the water droplets are shed.

The lovely weather earlier in the summer has been good news for one creature that surely everyone loves – the butterfly. Yes, I know that veggie gardeners will be throwing a fit and cursing the large white (aka Cabbage White) but that one apart, there are some real beauties on the go, and even 'white' butterflies are lovely! Did anyone see the lovely Orange Tip flitting about the flowers? It



has probably gone by now but there were good numbers. It is one member of the 'white' group and there are quite a few others. The Orange Tip has white wings but with a splash of orange colour on the tips of the forewings. Then there is the Green-Veined White, another lovely species. This one has white wings that are covered in a powdery green colour and there are very prominent veins, hence the common name.

Neither of these 'Whites' will eat your cabbages, they both prefer a delightful wildflower known as Cuckoo Flower. Each species of butterfly, and moth for that matter, have their own favourite plant on which they lay their eggs. Now, you never see a butterfly on the wing and holding a 'guide to tasty plants' book, they are much cleverer than that. When they land on a plant and they want to know if it is a cabbage or cacti, they 'feel' the surface with their tootsies, and amazingly they can tell what it is, using sensor hairs on their feet!

Now that is a party trick that you can try at your barbecue, off with socks and walk blindfold over some thistles. I am sure that you will 'feel' what they are!

Do get out and about and enjoy the natural world around Belhelvie this autumn.


