We hope that everyone is safe and well in the Balmedie School and wider community. At this point in the year, it may be useful to share some feedback on school life in ongoing COVID times.

With so many things impacted not just in school but in general life and how we live it, there are likely more questions than answers - even now (and the answers still can change weekly!). Where once we were most comfortable with being planned well in advance, we continue to find ourselves in a place where it feels that we remain a step behind COVID and await guidance on the next set of adjustments to be taken, on a weekly updated basis.

We are fortunate to have an excellent NHS partnership and fantastic support network between our schools and education service during such challenging times. There is more certainty and stability in relation to the main organisation and functioning of our school-adversity brings out the best of us and no better example of this than the incredible response, efforts and flexibility of our entire school staff throughout this pandemic.

We are now in a place where we are getting very much 'back on track' and we continue to look forwards and taking significant steps towards re-establishing the many lost opportunities COVID has postponed for us all.

At the heart of school recovery has been a very firm focus on the health and wellbeing of the children and I am pleased to say that almost all children have settled back into school tremendously well - everything right now is about getting back to the basics positively and building a positive momentum in all classes; promoting high levels of involvement, participation and a feeling within each child that they are comfortable and have a sense of being 'back on track'.

A main focus during our first term has been to encourage achievement, safety and inclusion. Via 'online' assemblies, we are presently exploring what it takes to be an achiever e.g. effort, lots of practise, not giving up, supporting each other, addressing any barriers that children may feel prevent them from making progress etc.

For some children this has been welcomed very naturally, for others there may be new challenges now and we all are requiring some time, support and adjustment just to consider how some aspects of school life (and general life) may still require some ongoing change or review. We also very much enjoy taking little steps towards reintroducing the 'normal' things we may have been missing and look optimistically towards a gradual (and measured) phasing in of more familiar school activities/events as time will allow.

Finally, I would also like to express our thanks from the school and the children to our families, FOBs/PTA and school partners for their ongoing patience, understanding and support as we head into the winter where I am sure more unknown challenges await...

BELHELVIE COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

We hope everyone is keeping well and safe. As you may be aware, at the start of the Covid-19 pandemic in March 2020, all Community First Responders were temporarily stood down by the Scottish Ambulance Service (SAS). However, in September 2020, we were issued with additional PPE and received specific Covid-19 CPR training which allowed us to start responding again which was fantastic news. We can be called upon by 999 despatchers to attend medical emergencies where we can help whilst an ambulance is on its way.



This year, First Responders Angela Cadger and Theresa Thomson were presented with a beautiful commemorative coin and a thank you card from the Scottish Ambulance Service. The coin represents a genuine thank you on behalf of SAS for their enduring commitment and support to their local community and the ambulance service in Scotland during the COVID pandemic.

We maintain the local public access defibrillators in Belhelvie, Potterton, Balmedie village and Balmedie country park, ensuring pads are in date and that the battery is working as it should, as well

as bearing the cost of insuring them against damage/theft. We receive no state funding, relying entirely on donations. 
We are looking to do some extra fundraising in the new year so we can install more public access defibrillators in our community as we believe that you cannot have enough of these life saving devices around!

BIODIVERSITY - IN YOUR HANDS



When we think of ecosystems, we think of the environment, but people are part of ecosystems. We benefit from the services they provide, from clean water to the health benefits of a countryside or beach walk.

An ecosystem is a geographic area where plants, animals and other organisms, as well as weather and landscapes, work together to form a bubble of life.

A sense of responsibility for the environment and biodiversity is a core value in Scottish culture.

Children and adults experience more first-hand learning about biodiversity in the open spaces around them, and this reinforces the demand for action at all levels to enrich biodiversity, not only in our rural environments but in our parks and golf courses, sports fields, transport corridors, green and brown-field sites.

Although our environments are of good quality they are changing and we continue to lose biodiversity, albeit at a lower rate but the loss is continuing. For example, there may be a tipping point where pressure on an ecosystem leads to gradual change up to a threshold beyond which there is a sudden, perhaps irreversible change.

A key issue is the intensity of resource use. Intensive and unsustainable resource use lies at the heart of much biodiversity loss in both terrestrial (dry land) and marine environments, but these have also been important factors in our economic development. Sustainable development, and sustainable resource use, recognises the need to balance social, economic, and environmental interests to ensure that the drive for economic growth does not compromise the welfare and quality of life of current and future generations. The continuing loss of biodiversity suggests that we have not yet achieved this balance.

Both adults and children in our communities can take a leading role to increase awareness, understanding and enjoyment of biodiversity, by restoring biodiversity in our urban, rural, and marine environments by engaging more in the conservation and enhancement of our landscapes and ecosystems. Participating in citizen science through community projects or recording biodiversity, for example recording pollinators and plants, can all contribute to improving biodiversity in our local areas. These interactions with our environment may also inform better planning decisions that can affect our future environment and possible biodiversity loss.



Recording biodiversity has become easier and faster in our digital age with the use of mobile phones. Many free Apps are available that enable us to get outdoors and start recording plants, pollinators, birds, and other wildlife using recognition technology that make it a great activity for adults and children. Various Apps can even tell you what to look for in your area according to season, like the iRecord Butterflies App. Community projects are a key way to record biodiversity, not only using technology but taking a simple notebook out when exploring and

recording any interesting finds. Why not try this in your neighbourhood or while visiting Balmedie Country Park, where there is lots to see and record.

Records can be logged as part of a community or school project on biodiversity and/or directly logged by individuals or communities with NESBREC (North East Scotland Biological Records Centre www.nesbrec.org.uk), who also want to understand biodiversity in our areas and its sustainability and resilience under human and environmental pressures. All records made to NESBREC are also taken into account as part of the planning process that may help aid better planning decisions regarding impacts on the environment and biodiversity.

A Sense of Love for Christmas

Thinking about Christmas this year can be a difficult thought for many, with the last minute disappointment of 'Christmas is cancelled' last year due to Covid. Every day there seems to be a new depressing news report about Christmas:

- 'Glasgow Christmas market and lights switch on scrapped' BBC 27.10.21
- 'Christmas tree prices skyrocket due to rising shipping costs' Daily Mail 21.10.21
- 'Christmas toys: shops admit demand could outstrip supply' iNews 21.09.21
- 'Families told to freeze Christmas dinner as festive shortages loom' Evening Standard 1.10.21
- 'How to survive a(nother) Covid Christmas' The Telegraph 29.10.21.

Recently I spoke to two generations from the opposite ends of time. The first, a wonderful lady in her 94th year who has celebrated 93 Christmases in very different and at times difficult circumstances. From her childhood in a house full of love and laughter to her time as a young adult during WWII, her adult life as a wife, as a mother, as a grandmother, as a widow and as a lady nearing the end of her days. When asked what her favourite thing about Christmas is, she replied, 'I love the singing. The hymns. My favourite is 'Good King Wenceslas'.

At the other end of the sands of time is the response from two young primary aged children aged 8 and 4 who haven't had nearly as many Christmases, but still know the wonder and excitement of this time of year. When asked what they they see, hear, smell, taste and touch when they hear the word Christmas they responded with:

See: snowmen, Christmas trees, snowy forests, family - sometimes our whole family, Christmas crackers and reindeer.

Hear: Santa, Santa's sleigh bells, Christmas songs, family playing games, people being happy.

Taste: biscuits and Christmas pudding.

Smell: sweets, biscuits and snow.

Touch: snow, the Elf on the shelf, giving presents and cuddles.

Across the generations one thing is clear, the sense of love felt at Christmas is something that can't be taken away from us or cancelled at the last minute. So this Christmas, rather than thinking about the things that might happen to spoil Christmas, why don't we hold on to the sense of love that has been felt across the generations.

However you celebrate the winter festivals in your home, wishing you and your loved ones a Christmas full of love.






CAN YOU WAG YOUR TAIL WHEN YOU SIT?

Try it! If you can, it means you are sitting the way you are designed to and not putting your back muscles, joints, and ligaments on strain!



The spine attaches to the top of the sacrum - where you sit are those bony bits you feel when you sit on your hands. As you see, your tailbone/coccyx attaches to the sacrum - if you had a tail, you should be able to wag it if you are sitting correctly! Don't sit on your tail!



Sitting on those bony bits/ischial tuberosities is the safest position for your back. You don't want to slump and 'hang' on your ligaments and put pressure on your tailbone. Neither do you want to put your back on strain by sitting up too straight. This tense posture affects breathing and energy levels. You are aiming for the middle one!

Your pelvis is the foundation for your body. If it is out of balance, then there will be strain. Add long hours of sitting, especially when working at computers at awkward heights, then this compounds any tension. Slumping and slouching in settees compounds the problem. Taking charge of posture is all important.

Your pelvis needs to be under you when you are sitting so you need your bottom behind you. That allows your tailbone to be free. If you sit with your bottom tucked underneath, you wouldn't be able to wag your tail!

We want the rounded bony sitting bones to roll forward. When they roll back, the trunk collapses. Our hip joints are the rotation points - not various parts of the spine!

How to sit

- You want your bony bits the sitting bones to be on the chair.
- Your feet need to be on the ground. If they don't reach, put a book under them!
- Thus, your weight is on the sitting bones, with some support from your feet.
- Now you can use your hips to move forward and backward no strain on the back.

With this stable base it is easier to sit in a more relaxed way, breathing and letting the shoulders relax. Lengthening the spine right up to the neck is now the goal. This is difficult and sometimes impossible to achieve with very tight muscles - this is where massage can help. Increased awareness will help you to relax your neck muscles and keep your neck over the rest of your spine - no more thrusting the chin forward - keep the back of the neck long.

If this is difficult, ask your therapist for advice. You may need to see an osteopath to realign parts of your spine.

If you are working at a computer, then do try to use the above advice and take frequent breaks. A short stand up and shake with some focused breathing can be enough to prevent tension accumulating with the resultant headaches and discomfort.

Being at the right height for your computer and allowing the fingers to do the work without holding shoulders up to your ears, will help sooo much.

There have been some changes at our local Police Station this year. We now have a new Community Beat Officer in Belhelvie Parish. PC Stacy Morrison was appointed to the role recently. She is working with communities and runs mobile surgeries throughout the Formartine area.

She is pictured below carrying out speed checks with school pupils who have been learning how the laser equipment works and asking drivers how they feel about speeding past





their schools. This falls under

Operation Cedar which tackles speeding and antisocial driving across the north-east with a view in reducing casualties on our roads.

Based at Ellon Police Station, PC Morrison works on a shift basis, so can attend our area at various times during the day should there be a need.

Another relatively new addition to the Formartine area is Inspector Mark Young who has been settling into the role by meeting with residents, businesses, councillors and local groups. He has taken on the post after an extensive career in the police force. Through questioning locals and

reviewing incidents in the area, Inspector Young recognises that each community in

Formartine has differing concerns, so the policing style for each community must be adaptable to their needs so the best service possible is delivered. He believes that police officers should be accessible, visible, and approachable and will endeavour to increase high visibility foot patrols across Formartine.

BLACKDOG NEWS

The last three months have been a busy time for the village of Blackdog, with a number of activities and actions having been taken to improve the village services and to enhance the surrounding environment.

In September, we engaged East Grampian Coastal Partnership to host a Blackdog beach

clean-up and with 14 volunteers we collected 163kg of waste off the beach and sand dunes. In October, 8 volunteers took part in a village tidy-up which resulted in 12 large bags of rubbish, wire-mesh fencing, tyres, wood and plastic waste etc. being collected, which filled the van we used to take the rubbish to a licensed waste facility. The amount of waste collected was testament to a great effort by our volunteers!

One thing that was disappointing, during the tidy-ups, was to see how much fly-tipping of waste there has been both in the village itself and in the surrounding areas. With licensed waste facilities and Council support available to remove larger items of waste streams, it is hard to comprehend why people continue to use the countryside and village communal areas to dispose of their waste.

Working with Aberdeenshire Council, the village has secured more communal bins within the community, which are dual purpose for both general and dog waste. These have been placed in areas where we feel will be the most benefit to keeping the village tidy and we hope that the added units will encourage both residents and visitors to dispose of their waste in a responsible manner.

The Council have also approved the siting of glass recycling units within the village, which are long overdue, and the three units should be available to our residents in the coming weeks.

A number of new park benches will be provided and sited within the village. These will be placed in regular walking areas and will benefit all our residents, especially those who may have age or mobility restrictions. We are also working with the Council to ensure that we have consistent adopted grass-cutting services within the village to support keeping Blackdog tidy.

Over the coming weeks we plan to engage the Council to ensure that everything is being done to educate and support the reduction of vehicle speeding within the village, which is a safety concern to all residents. The number of vehicles accessing/egressing the village has substantially increased over the last couple of years, with many of the vehicles not adhering to the speed limits. With the number of children and dogs residing within the village on the increase, this issue has become a serious safety concern.

Over the coming months, there will be an increase in heavy vehicles through the village as the deforestation of the North Woods takes place, prior to handing the land over to Kirkwood Homes. This is another safety concern and we will be working with the landowner to ensure that vehicles are properly controlled during the operation.

As winter approaches we have been surveying the number of sand/grit bins that are in the village and feel that extra bins would benefit the local area during severe frost/ice conditions. We will engage the appropriate Council Department for their advice and support, and hope to be identified as one of the priority areas for the large gritter lorries to service, as we have had a number of incidents over the last two years, due to icy road conditions, occurring at the new entrance to and exit from the village.

Last but not least, we are looking to see if there is anyone in the village, or throughout the surrounding communities, who may have old newspaper cuttings/historical articles about Blackdog that we could share with the community. The aim is to generate more interest in the history of the village. If you have anything that you feel would be newsworthy then please feel free to send to Alan Neave at East Blackdog Steading bigneavey@aol.com, who will be looking to collate the information. A WORD FROM THE DOC...

A Super Pandemic Christmas

It hardly seems credible, but we are heading towards a second pandemic Christmas, although some seem to think that Covid is no longer an issue! In reality, things are on a knife edge and

this winter is something that we are not really looking forward to from a medical point of view.

If you are eligible, then please take up the offer of your Covid booster jab and please make sure you get your flu jab too. One important point about both Covid booster and flu jabs, please DO NOT contact your GP practice. The co-ordination and administration of these jabs has been taken away from GP practices, so PLEASE do not further affect the already overcrowded phone lines by calling your GP to enquire about them. You will receive a letter telling you when and where to go. You can also look on NHS Inform, the Scottish Health Service website for details of how to get vaccinated. If you are housebound, and unable to get to the vaccine centres, there are contact details provided to call to let the teams know, so that your vaccines can be administered at your home.

We remain hugely busy, and currently we are consulting with very high numbers of people suffering with what the media have dubbed the 'Super Cold'. This is another unintended consequence of the actions taken to limit Covid. Due to the rules imposed to stop one virus, we have had hardly any of the more usual viruses either. As a result, our immune systems have become somewhat unfit. Normally your immune system is working away protecting you, but the pandemic restrictions have effectively left our systems, to use a sporting phrase, lacking match practice!

Now as restrictions are easing and we are beginning to get out and about again to the cinema, the pub or meeting with larger groups of friends, the ordinary common cold viruses can take advantage of this, as has always happened in the winter. When the cold virus strikes, it will mean that you are likely to have more marked and more prolonged symptoms than usual. Hence the so called 'Super Cold'. It is still a virus and sadly there are still no cures for the common cold, and antibiotics DO NOT help. Please bear in mind, you still need to check that you are not affected by Covid - the ONLY way to know is to do a test.

So when (note I don't say "if") you are afflicted, please follow the usual symptom control advice, taking rest, fluids, Paracetamol and stay at home to avoid spreading it to others - and do, at least, a lateral flow test to check for Covid. If needed you can see a pharmacist for advice, and under the Pharmacy First scheme even get some remedies for free. As many of us have not had a cold for almost two years, it is no surprise that when you do get one you will feel absolutely awful and because of our lower than usual immunity it will take much longer to settle.

There also been significant media coverage about the supposed lack of face-to-face appointments. GP practices are required to work under the still existing emergency measures. We are obliged to ensure that we keep our surgeries Covid secure, as many patients who do attend are still vulnerable to the effects of the virus, despite the vaccine programme. Rest assured, if the clinical situation requires a face-to-face appointment, you will be seen. There are many situations where phone or other 'remote' consultations are safe, and indeed many patients have expressed a preference in terms of convenience and access. With COP-26 having happened in Glasgow, and the focus on the climate emergency, not making a journey (when it is clinically safe and appropriate) to a physical appointment is also better for the planet! It needs to be pointed out that hospital specialists in almost all fields are still doing much of their initial consultations in this way, with, it seems, hardly any criticism. The other gain is that some consultations, particularly around mental health issues, could be very long, and patients often grumbled about sitting for a long time in the waiting room when they were next. This happens far less now, so there are some positive aspects to this enforced change for everyone.

Practices are indeed open - they never closed - but entry is necessarily controlled to keep everyone safe. I only mention this again, as I am still amazed that many seem to believe the stories which have more to do with newspaper circulation than facts. A degree of festive good cheer and pleasantness would be very welcomed by GP staff, as the almost daily abuse and nastiness, fed by the continuing media misinformation, makes an already difficult job much harder.

All of us are heartily sick and tired of the pandemic and it is now, more than ever, that we need to try and take a little bit of time and try to be kind to one other. Please do not take out any frustrations you may feel on staff who only wish to help you. Much of these frustrations have been caused by the world-changing events inflicted by the nearly two years of pandemic we have endured so far. This goes for all areas of public service, not only GP surgeries.

Christmas is coming up very fast and I hope we can all have a fun, safe and enjoyable time and, who knows, in 2022 we just might see an end to the pandemic. I certainly hope so, and may I wish everyone a super, happy, healthy, Christmas time!






messages. Our last night of term was spent outside around a campfire with marshmallows and campfire songs. We've tried to make as much use of the nice weather as possible by playing all our games outside.

LOOKING FORWARD TO 2022

The Sand Bothy and Balmedie Beach Wheelchairs will re-open in the spring, and we will be looking at new ways of using the Sand Bothy, running events and classes and renewing our contacts with Balmedie and other schools. We will maintain and promote our Changing Places facility and inclusive play equipment. We will continue to maintain the Sensory Garden, promote its use and hold events there. The next stage of the Potterton Project is to install a fence and path along the side of the cleared part of the burn, and plant hedge trees and burnside plants. Apart from developing our community projects in 2022, we will be sending out a community questionnaire to every household in the parish to ask what community facilities you would like to see developed or created. Look out for the questionnaire in the spring of 2022!

ABERDEENSHIRE COUNCIL NEWS

Councillor Andrew Hassan shares some news:

The second half of 2021 has again been a busy time for your elected representatives on Aberdeenshire Council, with most meetings remaining 'virtual', in line with the guidance we adhere to. Our meetings are webcast on the Council's website, and the recordings left for public viewing following the meetings. Back in August, Jim Gifford, Paul Johnston and I were joined by our new colleague Sheila Powell, who was successful in the by-election held following Karen Adam's resignation. I cannot imagine what it must be like taking up our post mid-term, but there is much going on and much to do - and having a full complement of Councillors again helps the Ward greatly. As an aside, we all thank the many officials who participated in the running of the By-election. They will (I suspect) all be called upon again in the Full Council election coming up on the 5th May next year.

Meetings of Formartine Area Committee

At the August meeting, members were presented with an application for funding from the Area Committee Budget from Balmedie Leisure Centre for a grant of £5,000 towards their planned accessible and inclusive play area and outdoor space to provide the community with a play space with equipment for children with disabilities. The grant provided 7.2% of the project cost.

At the September meeting we authorised the statutory procedure for the 2021 Disabled Street Parking Order. There are planned spaces on Forsyth Drive and Forsyth Road in Balmedie, and Laingseat Road, Potterton. We also discussed reports covering Flood Risk, Built Heritage, and the Outdoor Access Strategy.

In October we had a number of notable items for Belhelvie parish. The Scottish Fire and Rescue Report for April to June was reported - with notably 'unwanted fire alarm signals' in Mid Formartine showing at a five year high in this ward. These are most common in non-residential properties.

We also received a report we had asked for on the Litter Issues at our Country Parks, including Balmedie. We were advised that the most common type of littering at the Country Parks is at 'honeypot sites' which are specific areas attractive to tourists. The report advised that these sites will be more closely monitored with currently under-utilised existing bins potentially being relocated to try and resolve the issues.

Most notably at this meeting, we received an update on the 'South Formartine Schools Options Appraisal'. It is well known that our Education Officers are keeping a keen eye on the capacity pressures of our existing schools at both Balmedie and up at Foveran, with increased housing identified in the Local Development Plan which is currently with the Scottish Government Reporter for examination. The appraisal will address the roll and capacities within several schools as well as housing pressures from the sites in the South Formartine corridor. Officers have promised a robust review of the factors to ensure an informed decision is reached at the appropriate time.

We expect the Local Development Plan to be sent to Scottish Ministers in early 2022, and thereafter hope to have a more detailed paper on this matter to elected members as soon as possible, to ensure our education estate is fit for the area going forward.

Meetings of Full Council

There have been three meetings of Full Council since the summer. Back in September, the notable paper of discussion was on the subject of how Council meetings are held - with a transition to a choice base (hybrid) model being proposed. It is notable that during the covid period, Councillor costs reduced by 92%. It was further noted that some Councillors now prefer the 'working at home' arrangement, not least as it helps the Council meet its Climate Change Declaration and Carbon Budget. However, there was also recognition that the online meeting format does not suit all - and my own personal opinion is that we must remain 'public' as there are residents in our constituencies that would like to see and hear their representatives that may not be 'IT-informed' meaning they could only do so by turning up in person to hear us in a public venue, and we have an equalities duty to ensure their needs are taken into account. A trial has now begun where some committees will work to the proposed hybrid model, with a report back on this initial trial expected at the January meeting of Full Council.

The second meeting was held on the same day - with a one-item agenda to discuss the Scheme for the establishment of Community Councils. This acknowledged the consultation period, approved the revised scheme and agreed that it would commence in January 2022.

Finally, we had a meeting on the 6th October with another one-item agenda, this time to discuss the Council's response to the Scottish Government's National Care Service Consultation - which was a pretty mixed one with both positives and negatives highlighted. The draft can be read in full on the Aberdeenshire Council website.

Away from formal meetings, your local Councillors continue to get lobbied on several matters locally in all the settlements that make up Belhelvie Parish - and are happy to hear from constituents at any time. We also regularly attend BCC meetings and can answer questions. Please feel free to get in touch at any time if you feel we may be able to assist.

Our new Formartine Councillor Sheila Powell introduces herself:

I can hardly believe it is two months since I was elected as your new Councillor for Mid Formartine. It has been an extremely busy time, I have had such a lot to learn but have received a tremendous amount of support from all the Aberdeenshire Councillors, as well as Council Officers. I made a promise when elected that I would do my best to protect our area and work hard for the benefit of all our residents.

One issue I have been involved in was the use of Potterton Community Centre for all. The restrictions of Covid had made it impossible for the senior members of our community to return to the hall. However, the Bowling Group have now returned on a Thursday afternoon. If any other groups in the area wish to use the hall, it is available on the other weekday afternoons, 3pm until 5pm.

Unfortunately, the upstairs floor of the Centre cannot be used by the public at this time, due to the results from a recent health and safety inspection on the external escape route metal stair. Repairs may be authorised in due course to enable the residents to use the upper floor once again if required.

Please remember that your Mid Formartine Councillors are here for you, do not hesitate to make contact if you need us. Winter is upon us, so take care and keep safe.
