### THE BENEFITS OF VOLUNTEERING



When I look back on my years of volunteering at the Sand Bothy, I remember the long queues for ice cream on a sunny day, the queue for a hot chocolate on a cold one, but most importantly the amazing people I worked alongside and the sense of community.

Little did I know, that when I started volunteering at the Sand Bothy in the summer of 2018, it would not only lead me to gain my silver Duke of Edinburgh Award but also help me to secure Depute Head Girl, a part-time job and a committee role at university.

As part of the Duke of Edinburgh Award, you must complete a section on volunteering. I approached the Sand Bothy and asked for weekend work - they happily accepted and I started volunteering immediately. I spent the summer months of 2018 and 2019 making teas and coffees and serving customers with ice-cream, drinks and snacks.

From volunteering at the Sand Bothy, with such an amazing group of people, I gained valuable experience in speaking to and serving members of the public. One of the best things was that the Sand Bothy was within walking distance of my house and I worked with lovely people from around our local community. Rosie at the Sand Bothy completed my Duke of Edinburgh Assessment and along with that and the other tasks I had to complete I achieved my Silver Award in my 6th year.

I believe that doing voluntary community work was a benefit when applying to university. I also got a part-time weekend job which I still do now in my 3rd year at university at a coffee shop. The vital skills, including communication, organisation, problem-solving and people skills are what ultimately contributed to securing these positions.



If any other young people in the Balmedie area are planning to do a Duke of Edinburgh award or any other qualification where voluntary work is required, do go and speak to Joni at the Sand Bothy. The experience I gained working there has been invaluable to me and I would highly recommend it.

We have such an amazing beach on our doorstep, that many of us, including me, sometimes take it for granted. Joining the Sand Bothy team, as a volunteer, even if it is just for a couple of hours a week, can make a huge difference to our local community. And allows us, as residents, and young people in our community, to give back.

### BLACKDOG NEWS from Blackdog Residents' Association (BRA)

During the six months that have passed since our last contribution to the Banter, our residents and village volunteers have had a productive time in Blackdog, getting involved in activities that have improved the surrounding environment within our community.



Our Village and Beach Tidy-Ups continue to have a successful impact on removing waste and litter from the grass verges, communal land and beach area at Blackdog. We are still on track to achieve our target of completing a Tidy-Up each month in 2022. The amount of waste collected has such a positive impact on the environment and it continues to be a testament to the great effort by all our volunteers.

We have been able to complement our own planned activities by receiving a beach box (pictured above) from East Grampian Coastal Partnership, with litter-pick equipment for all residents and visitors to use when they visit Blackdog Beach. The box is open for use, 24 hours a day, and helps to support the 'Take 4 for the Shore' initiative.

Our residents have reaped the benefit of all the hard work of our volunteers, in populating our planters and communal areas with annual bedding plants and perennials, ensuring a wonderful display of flowers due to the perfect storm of weather - long hours of sunshine and thunder plumps of rain! Our thanks go to all our volunteers that take part in this activity and to Aberdeenshire Council for their generous donation of plants.

We are delighted to say that we now have a defibrillator purchased and sited within Blackdog village, and we cannot thank Arnold Clark enough for their kind donation that has allowed us to progress and complete this project for the village. Belhelvie First Responders will maintain the unit on behalf of the village. We would also like to thank Archer Marketing for allowing the unit to be fitted outside their premises and to thank Jamie Dunbar, from the village, for kindly giving his services free to install the unit.

Blackdog received its long overdue glass recycling units in the village and we would like to thank the Council for their support to make this happen. That apart, we have struggled to get movement on several initiatives, and a lack of monies, personnel, materials, etc. continue to delay their progress and completion. It is clear that if we want to progress many of these items we will, as a village, need to fund-raise and self-support these projects.

One of the initiatives is the development of a small, attractive garden area, like the Sensory Garden at Balmedie, where all ages can go to enjoy the flowers, trees etc. Our thoughts would be to have park benches, small environmental learning areas for children, new planters and other attractions for all to enjoy. The Council have offered us advisory support, and shrubs and trees, should the project be a viable option.



We have also engaged Vattenfall to support the upkeep of the grass verges beside the 'Vattenfall Path' in the village (pictured opposite). We discussed the initial development of the area as a potential community project with Vattenfall, their contractors and Blackdog volunteers all working together to plant new shrubs, wildflowers and bushes to make it into a sustainable environmental attraction which would then be maintained by Vattenfall on a regular basis.

The new Kirkwood housing development in Blackdog is progressing at a steady rate with preliminary groundwork and the building of show houses well underway. At the same time, the oil-remediation project led by FCC at Blackdog Landfill site has also started their initial groundwork. The community continues to monitor these activities to ensure that no safety concerns develop due to the increase of heavy equipment into the area.

Our Blackdog Gala Day in August was a great success and following this, we will be holding a Christmas event within the village in early December. The village tree and lights display last year were a huge success with our residents, and we will build on that success this year, with a get together in the Community Park with village children taking part in switching on the Christmas tree lights.

With 2023 looming on the horizon, we sincerely hope that the new year will bring some much needed amenities and infrastructure to our village - we can but wish!

### **POTTERTON BURN**

In early 2021 Belhelvie Community Trust (BCT) was asked to consider a proposal from residents to improve the burn at Potterton to alleviate flooding, clear blocked field drains and improve risks and smells from deep stagnant water.

BCT applied to Scottish Landfill Community Fund for help and were successful in getting enough money to clear the burn and drains, erect fences and improve water flow and to install paths and picnic tables in the park land.



The burn will never have a great flow rate as it relies on the run-off from the road system during rainy periods. Also, the change in gradient is not great to aid the flow of the burn, nonetheless when the burn was cleared it had a steady flow. It did become evident this summer, that the burn will need regular clearing, as in hot dry weather. the vegetation on the

burn started to return. Even in the relatively brief period since clearing the burn the wildlife around it has improved, with brief visits from Mallards and small fish being found further upstream.

Volunteers have been working to enhance the surrounding area, planting hedge trees along the burn and suitable wild plants along the bank. Old redundant tree guards and dead

trees have been removed, branches trimmed, and path edges strimmed. A wheelchair-accessible picnic table has been added and bird-nesting boxes have been installed.

Potterton Volunteers have been formed, which is an amalgamation of the Potterton Burn Project volunteers and Potterton



Green Fingers. By combining, we will have more volunteers, and volunteers will have a wider range of tasks such as: maintaining the burn and the park, developing the park, planting, and tending to planters and tubs around the village, raising funds for inclusive play equipment, litter picking and developing links with other groups.

Potterton Volunteers will be meeting at regular intervals to work together at the park land. Check the Potterton Volunteers Facebook page for details - everyone is welcome!

### **POTTERTON PLANTING**

### "GRIEF IS THE PRICE WE PAY FOR LOVE"

So much has changed since we last published Banter. Not only have we had a change of Prime Minister, but we have also seen the death of our Queen, and the arrival of a new King. Whether we are in favour of the monarchy or not, we cannot but recognise the achievements of Queen Elizabeth II (I of Scotland) during her reign of seven decades. Throughout her reign, she has shown a strong sense of duty and determination to dedicate her life to her throne and her

people. She was a constant in a rapidly changing world and her success in maintaining the monarchy throughout such turbulent times should be celebrated - and her death mourned.

The extended coverage of her death and funeral, and images of her grieving family led to a public outpouring of emotion. Seeing images of her grieving sons, daughter and grandchildren has perhaps triggered both mourning for the departed Queen but also rekindled grief for our own losses. While the nation witnessed images of collective grief on television, many were catapulted back into remembering their own sad losses. Reminded of a parent's or partner's passing or that of close friends and other family members, this can also lay bare feelings and concerns about one's own mortality.

Bereavement, grief and loss can cause many different symptoms and they affect people in different ways. Grief is considered to change over time and there is no right or wrong way to feel.

At first, you may be caught up in a whirlwind of things that need to be organised while at the same time you feel shocked and numb. As time passes, the initial full support from friends and family may fade. You may feel less numb. At this stage, you may start to experience how different your life is without your loved one and begin grieving for that loss while slowly adapting to your new situation.

Grief counsellors reckon that it generally takes about a year to realise how much has changed in your life, both emotionally and practically. Some things only come up once a year, like celebrating a birthday or Christmas or taking over the role of something the person who has died used to do, like renewing the car insurance. Each time one of these things happens, you are reminded of your loss, and your feelings of grief may come to the surface. It may feel as if you are on an emotional roller coaster, where one minute you are coping and the next you feel overwhelmed by grief. You are likely to find you have some good days and some bad days. As time passes, the balance between good days and bad days shifts and gradually you may find you have more good days and fewer bad days. But these changes are gradual, and each person is different, so the balance for you may not be the same as someone else after the same length of time. Taking care of yourself by eating well, getting some exercise and enough sleep will help.

There is no timetable for how long you will grieve. The length of time is different for each person. For most people their mourning period is a long, gradual process. Your grief is not something that can or should be 'fixed'. The goal is to find a way to live with and cope with your feelings while taking time to grieve in your own way. Grief is forever but over time it will vary in intensity, what it feels like, and how it is part of your life. Events and places may bring back memories and trigger sadness, but life can still stay positive around grief.

Moving on doesn't mean that you are forgetting the person who has died. It just means you've accepted your bereavement. You can move on with your life and keep the memory of someone as an important part of you. Gradually, through meeting new people, having new experiences and moments of enjoyment, grief will hopefully no longer dominate, as you, and your life, grow around it.

Support groups and organisations can help. The Sunrise Partnership is an Aberdeen charity offering free bereavement counselling (call 07827 755735). Help can also be found at 'Possibilities' (call 07593 768129). Both these organisations have websites and Facebook pages for further information. Cruse Bereavement Care (call 0808 808 1677) offers some strategies that may help:

- try talking about your feelings to a friend, family member, health professional or counsellor / contact a support organisation (see above)
- get help if you're struggling to sleep
- don't try to do everything at once set small targets easily achieved
- do not focus on the things you cannot change focus your time and energy into helping yourself feel better
- try not to tell yourself that you're alone most people feel grief after a loss and support is available
- try not to use alcohol, cigarettes, gambling or drugs to relieve grief these can all contribute to poor mental health
- have a look at the Cruse Bereavement Care website for further support https://www.cruse.org.uk

Queen Elizabeth herself quoted "Grief is the price we pay for love". It is quite a price, and for some, it must seem as if there is no way forward at times. However, come time, it becomes manageable and part of the person we have become. We can move on within a life that is changed irreversibly, but able to enjoy new beginnings and experiences, while bolstered by memories that never die.

### **PIRI PIRI**

The issue of the massively destructive plant Piri Piri Burr started around 2012 when the invasive species from New Zealand was found in Forvie Nature reserve. It is thought that the seeds originally came over to the UK on imported wool. Since then, it's unfortunately been transferred to the dunes area on the northern side of Balmedie Beach (probably via shoes or trousers) and the grass areas behind.

Piri is a small plant, roughly clover size, that creeps across the ground in an almost continuous carpet. One small barbed head holds hundreds of seeds. Once ready, these barbs stick to anything they come in contact with, animals, birds, humans as

they walk through the seed heads, and are then transferred to new areas where they start new plants. Because of this, and the amount of use the beach gets, the issue has grown exponentially.

The main issues with it are that it hinders our natural flora and fauna in the area by competing with native plants and sticking to birds and small animals, causing matting and even death due to inability to feed, hunt and avoid predation. It has also caused huge issues for dog owners, with dogs becoming so heavily matted they are required to be shaved to remove seeds and matting. These seeds can also become embedded into dogs' skin and paws causing infections.

This year I decided to take steps and contact both the council and Trump International and work together with volunteers to try and reduce the spread a bit. The only two options are weed killer or weeding very carefully so as to cause as little seed dispersal as possible. Generally, weeding is looked on as the best option from previous places with this issue. We have endangered species in our dune



system, so that's the route we took. Thanks to everyone who volunteered, we cleared a huge amount, about 20 bin bags full. These were then disposed of via furnace by Trump International. Altogether we may need to do this annually. It's definitely made a huge difference and will continue to reduce the spread for years to come. Thanks to everyone who volunteered their spare time!

### WHAT ARE 'TRAPPED NERVES', 'PINCHED NERVES'? Can anything be done?



Nerve pain can feel like an electric shock. Sometimes pain shoots down the leg (sciatica). In trigeminal neuralgia, it shoots in the face. Nerve pain can present **anywhere** with stabbing, burning and/or numbness, deadness, tingling, weakness and more.

Nerves are essential for transmitting electrical signals throughout the body allowing you to move muscles and feel sensations. The brain signals/commands go through the spinal cord to the rest of the body along certain paths. Heart rate, breathing, digestion, sweating and more are also controlled by nerves.

Nerves are vulnerable where they travel through narrow spaces but have little soft tissue to protect them. Often, there is irritation of nerves as they exit through the hole between the vertebrae, from the

spinal cord. This can be caused by the facet joint not being able to move as it should. Mobilising or adjusting the spine is necessary along with techniques to relieve muscle spasm and congestion. Often, releasing trigger points in the affected muscles can ease the nerve pain easily.

Changes in bone, ligament, muscle, tendon or the 'cling film' wrapping/connective tissue around these structures can compromise a nerve resulting in pain etc. This is then further aggravated by the body's protective inflammatory reaction attempting to bring healing chemicals in a fluid, to an already congested area. This causes more pain and irritation to the nerve and the surrounding muscles and ligaments. Muscles tense and splint the injured area, interfering with area's drainage. Pain can be felt in the low back, groin, ribs, shoulder and/or blade, neck, arm or numbness in hands and fingers, <u>sciatica</u> and so on.

This congestion and interference affect the area itself or where the nerve signal is going. Having a tingling 'pinky' usually means that all is not well at the base of the neck. Osteopathic adjustments can help dramatically. If left unresolved, and with persistent lack of function and motion, the risk is that the damage will be harder to reverse due to scarring and the body's tissues getting sticky. In older people or those with past injuries, there may be degeneration contributing to the problem - even more reason to keep muscles as healthy as possible! Tight muscles contribute to most pains and are eased with massage which also assists drainage. Chronic conditions may result if the painful and debilitating condition is not treated. This can be a life changing problem.

Taking painkillers may help in the short term but really the best advice is to seek help as soon as possible to find the <u>root cause</u>. Any drug brings with it additional problems and surgery is rarely needed - try less invasive options first!

Nerve pain can also occur after a stroke. Reflexology and Remedial and Sports Massage after a stroke/CVA can bring amazing results. Keeping your body exercised and stretched to improve posture, mobility and strength, along with a healthy diet without preservatives, and drinking water is always advised. Sufficient 'me time', rest and sleep help bring the body into balance so it can repair as it was designed to do.

#### A WORD FROM THE DOC... Testing Times

This year is certainly one that will never be forgotten. There seems to be no end to the challenges that we are facing, caused by many things beyond our control. I feel that my last piece on resilience was well timed and hopefully useful. Perhaps recent events have made

my missives a bit more serious, it is hard to be flippant these days!

My job has also never been so challenging and demanding. There has been a significant increase in the amount of people requesting to be seen, with less GPs available to see these people. Some days we can speak to, see, or visit over 100 people. No that is not a misprint that is the actual number that I have dealt with as have colleagues, on more than one occasion in the past year. This is clearly a matter of concern, and this is not a unique problem. This why we are continuously advertising for more doctors and other staff but given almost every practice is trying to do the same it is a real challenge for us all.

This is one of the reasons that I am always trying to encourage you all to adopt healthier lifestyles, so that the chances that you need to be seen will be lower. This touches on a well-known problem for the health service, this is called the 'Inverse Care Law'. This term was coined by Dr Julian Tudor-Hart, who worked for many years in a deprived area in the Welsh Valleys. It can be summed up as the people who ask for health care the most, need it the least, whilst those who really need to be seen ask the least. This paradox is most apparent when there is a celebrity led campaign around 'getting tested' for various diseases.

This is essentially screening and should only be considered when there is a simple, safe and well-defined test, along with a good understanding of the disease process of the condition being tested for and acceptable, successful treatment that can be offered. This is summed up as the 'Wilson and Jungner' criteria, please feel free to search for this to get a detailed explanation.

Many will rightly think that they should seek an appointment to discuss a concern and 'get tested' for a whatever disease is 'popular' in the media. This is on top of the screening programmes that are already done, such as the stool test for blood to screen for bowel cancer. A good example is prostate cancer testing for people with no symptoms. This is promoted as a 'simple blood test', the PSA, which can 'save your life'. Unsurprisingly this can lead to many requests for this test, which is indeed easy to do, but the problem is that the Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA) blood test, when just being used to screen for cancer, is not really that good. The problem is that too often the result can be falsely reassuring or can be a cause for unnecessary worry as it is too often raised by other causes, not just cancer.

In 2018 when Stephen Fry announced that he had prostate cancer, this possibly led to an extra 47 tests being done by our surgery, compared to the same period the year before. This meant 47 extra consultations, or prolonging of consultations, representing, assuming 10 minutes per patient, about 470 minutes, almost 8 hours of extra work for the GP, plus time for the tests to be done and processed.

As no test found any cancer, we can debate if this was time and expense well spent as almost all the patients tested had no symptoms of concern. This does however show the significant effect and extra work promotional campaigns can have on the NHS, and when added onto an already stretched system, it causes a real headache, particularly when most requests for testing came from patients who are at low risk of cancer in the first place. This is a good example of what Dr Tudor-Hart meant.

An important part of my role is to try and be careful in the use of tests and testing. It is important to understand the clinical context, know the limitations of the test, and be able to explain this to the patient. Ideally tests should be done to answer specific clinical questions, not on demand. A blood test, scan or x-ray can have unexpected and unintended consequences and need to be approached with care. I like to keep people as people and not turn them into patients!

Returning to my initial theme, please make sure that you attend the vaccine centres for your covid booster and flu jab (if eligible). Please do not contact your GP regarding this as we have no role now in delivering this - contact NHS Grampian or look on NHS Inform for details.

May I wish you all a good, hopefully not too cold winter and festive season, and hopefully 2023 will be a bit better. At least we should have a Coronation to look forward to. Finally, just in case you thought I'd forgotten, keep active, eat well and try your best to stay away from the doctor !

We are delighted to announce that we now have a sixth Public Access Defibrillator (PAD) installed in our local area. The Blackdog Residents Association received funding from the Arnold Clark Community Fund to have the new unit and outdoor storage cabinet installed on The Archers Marketing building on Hareburn Terrace in Blackdog. It is directly across from the children's playpark and Banbury Cross Nursery. The Belhelvie Community First Responders will carry out the regular checks and maintenance on this defib just like we do with the 5 other units in our area. If you need to access the defib please dial 999 to request an ambulance and ask for the code to unlock the cabinet.

We were pleased to be invited along to the Blackdog Gala at the end of August. We brought along our Resus Anne mannikin and training defib so we could do demonstrations and let people practice performing CPR and using a defib. The weather was really kind to us and it was a wonderful day out.



First Responders Theresa Thomson and Angela Cadger were honoured to be presented by the Scottish Ambulance Service (SAS) with a Queens Jubilee Medal to recognise 5 years of service. "The medals represent a genuine thank you for your service and to recognise your enduring dedication as emergency Community First Responders in your community."

Finally, we would like to wish Donald Montgomery from the SAS a long and happy retirement. Donald has been the Community Resilience Facilitator in Grampian for over 5 years following a long career on the road with SAS. Donald has looked after us from the very beginning of our journey in terms of training, medical kits bags, PPE, etc. He has been a wonderful mentor to us - all the best Donnie!

At the meeting in August, we had a prolonged discussion on aspects of the 2022 Local Development Plan which has been sent back to us for approval by the Scottish Government Reporter. Whilst I appreciate it will not be popular locally, the reporter has retained the housing sites in Potterton, so they remain. Planning applications are likely now to follow, and at the appropriate time anyone with concerns on these areas can again intimate their points when they are brought forward for determination.

The recommendation to delete the need for a Community Centre in Belhelvie was challenged and will feature in any future reports to Full Council prior to formal adoption of the plan. At that same meeting, amongst numerous planning applications, we discussed for the final time the planning application for the Rainnieshill Quarry which has generated a lot of focus in both this parish, Udny and Newmachar - Committee unanimously refused the application due to adverse impact on both the landscape and the amenity of neighbouring properties, prominence of the site, and the limited evidence of need for a quarry given the information presented. The Roads Capital Works for the coming year were presented. Surface Dressing is planned for the Belhelvie to Potterton Road and Gourdie Park in Potterton this year - and new lighting will be installed in Belhelvie and Blackdog. Finally, we approved the renewal of disabled parking spaces on Forsyth Drive in Balmedie and Laingseat Road in Potterton amongst others.

In September we discussed the quarterly report from the Fire and Rescue Service. Mid Formartine has seen a worrying rise this year in both Non-Fire Emergencies (predominantly Road Traffic Incidents), and Unwanted Fire Alarm Signals. However, it is reassuring that the local teams remain well staffed, and there has been a reduction in casualties from fire-specific incidents. We also had discussion on the proposal to bring in a 'hybrid booking system' for the Household Recycle Centres which will report back to Environment and Infrastructure Services.
