

ALLAN JEFFREY - A SAD LOSS

It is with great sadness that we, at Banter, write about the passing of a great friend and selfless contributor to our local community. Allan Jeffrey, a well-loved Balmedie resident, died in June this year. A constant participator in Balmedie community projects, he was an early member of Better Balmedie and was committed to its work for most of its 14 years. He was also a founding member of Belhelvie Community Trust, as a trustee and its chair for a year. He was the


inspiration for Balmedie Sensory Garden, and a dedicated supporter of The Sand Bothy and Balmedie Beach Wheelchairs. He was also a member of the Friendship Club for many years, contributing in all sorts of ways.

On the day of his funeral, Belhelvie Church was overflowing with all who wished to pay their last respects. There, Rosie Nicol, Secretary of Belhelvie Community Trust, gave an insight into Alan's community life:

"Allan loved meeting people, trying new things, telling stories, and seeing nature work its magic. He loved to learn, to challenge himself and grow. He enjoyed working hard building useful things like walls, benches and planters for the village (including the train and the pea green boat). His aim was simple, to help others, make things a bit better and play his part in the groups he was involved in. His contribution to our village was enormous, but he often said that he too felt supported by other volunteers particularly after his wife Mary's death.

At the Sand Bothy, Allan was often seen in fancy dress as he entertained visitors and he was proud of his barista skills learned at the Bothy kiosk. Most of all though, he will always be remembered by children - of all ages - as Santa - at the Bothy and at other Christmas events in Balmedie. He had a rare ability to make every child feel special.

Allan was very positive about life, with a smile for us all, and he also loved to dream, to imagine, and to inspire others. He became an accomplished photographer and took many shots of the local area. He wrote reams of poems which he made personal to the recipient, offering support, encouragement, condolence, or humour. Allan was a well-loved man, and he will be dearly missed by many."



Over the spring and summer, our volunteers have been busy in the garden with all the usual garden tasks of planting, pruning, weeding and watering. We try to keep the colours going throughout the year, from daffodils and bluebells to sea hollies and lilies.

Our biggest project has been the creation of our 'Mega Bed', a long perennial border. It has been a lot of hard work, but well worth the effort with lots of lovely flowers appearing over the summer, from big clumps of shasta daisies to bright spiky gladioli. We are now the proud owners of a ride-on mower which makes life a bit easier for our mowers. We also have a smart purpose-built noticeboard so we can let you know what is happening at Belhelvie Community Trust and in the garden.

Our willow classroom and arbour developed some bald patches in the early part of the year, so Deeside Willow stepped in to repair and replace as necessary, and both are now thriving beautifully. We have a willow tunnel planned for the springtime.

Most important of all, the garden has increased in popularity with folks and families of all ages. We love seeing regular visitors too from Links Nursery, Balmedie School Nursery, Balmedie Primary School, Beavers, Brownies and other groups. Look out for our fun trails to be enjoyed by the younger visitors to the garden.

Balmedie Sensory Garden, which is up the wee road to the south of the library is open all the time, so we hope you will have a wander through, or even join our hard-working squad of volunteers. You will be very welcome.

ON THE BUSES

Stagecoach recently introduced new timetables across their Aberdeenshire network. These were largely because of funding changes from Aberdeenshire Council, as well as economic review over the viability of individual buses. Many concerns were raised over the routing of the new X65 service. Most of the concerns were eliminated following discussion with Stagecoach. The 290 / 291 route serving Potterton, Belhelvie and Whitecairns area has not been significantly altered. The new X65 service which replaced several routes serving Blackdog and Balmedie has for most of the day resulted in a similar service or in some cases improved service. The gap which has arisen has been the service from Aberdeen between 15.00 and 17.00. Whilst the X63 has an hourly service to Balmedie from Aberdeen, it does not serve Blackdog or anyone wishing to go to Ellon from Blackdog or Balmedie during this period. This discrepancy has been flagged to Stagecoach who advised that the reduction was based on usage at this time necessitating the cuts. Links to the new timetables are listed below:

Stagecoach also has an App which helps with Journey Planning and provides live updates. The App has recently been updated to give better up to the minute data. There have been a few teething problems but it seems to be working better now. Stagecoach also has Facebook and X (Twitter) accounts which are a source of service information.

Several issues have been identified including buses not turning up. This could be because of driver shortage or incidents on route. The bus company is struggling to recruit enough drivers. They are prepared to offer training if anyone in our area is looking for a new career.

It is important that we all report problems with the service as unless these are reported the bus company has no visibility of the problems. Contact details are available in the App. Similarly, when the bus company publishes proposed changes for consultation it is important to raise concerns during this process as once a new timetable is implemented it won't be changed until the next upgrade.

The level of service is very much driven by the level of usage, so it is important that we all use the bus whenever it is feasible to do so, to ensure that our services remain at current levels or hopefully even improve.

The Belhelvie Community Council will arrange for paper copies of bus service details to be produced and distributed to the Premier Store, the Co-op and the Library for people who do not have access to the internet.

Over the past year, many communities investigated creating a Warm Hub, to be used in the event of an emergency (such as Storm Arwen) or to support people experiencing high energy costs. Belhelvie Community Trust looked for suitable premises for such a Hub for our area and were fortunate to be able to pair up with Balmedie Congregational Church (The Wee Kirk), who had received a grant from the Rural Communities Fund (Scottish Government) to install a generator. Thus, the Balmedie Hub and Community Larder was born, hosted by Trust volunteers, located in the Wee Kirk and supported by Balmedie Co-op.

The Hub does not just provide a warm place or a hot drink in a time of need but has become an opportunity for strangers to become friends, folks to come and chat, play games, do jigsaws, or borrow a book as well as take needed items from the Community Larder.

Young, old, and those in between, are welcome to drop in any time during our opening hours from 10am - 1pm every Monday. You will be welcomed with a hot drink, a fine piece and friendly chat and there is no charge. And if you would like to volunteer to help host the Hub, please pop in or phone Joni on 07752 768918. THREADBARE by Mary Cane







BLACKDOG NEWS

The Blackdog community and its small band of volunteers have been involved in a variety of tasks over the last six months, supporting ongoing and new projects in the area, and taking part in activities to improve our village.

We continued to meet our targets in 2023 with regards to our Village and Beach Tidy-Ups. These waste gathering activities continue to have such a

positive impact on the environment within Blackdog. Our focus has also included the removal of the tree guards from the sapling trees that were planted when the new road was developed. Those of you who walk or drive past the grass verges will see a significant change in the health of the trees in this area which are now thriving. A big 'Thank You' goes to the volunteers who took part in this activity, and we were delighted to have the tree guards recycled to a local rewilding team and the damaged stakes turned into kindling for handing out to our residents who have wood-burning stoves or open fires.

It has also been a busy time for the helpers who support the green areas and planters within the village. We continue to have the support from our residents who cut the grass verges and the Community Park and want to take this opportunity to thank them for their commitment to keeping these areas tidy. We have also been busy filling our village planters (see above) with annual bedding plants and look forward to taking part in a bulb planting exercise. Our thanks to all volunteers who help and to Aberdeenshire Council for their generous donation of plants.

We continue to engage Aberdeenshire Council on issues that are close to the hearts of our residents, and we were delighted to see that a project to build a lit pathway from Strabathie Cottages to the Blackdog bus stop has been completed. This path will considerably reduce the time it takes to walk to the bus stop from the centre of the village and we thank the Council for their support in bringing this project to fruition. We have also been working closely with the team who are looking to determine the feasibility for a Council supported community facility in Blackdog. The initial feasibility studies for this project have been completed and the team are now applying for funding to support the next phase. For a village that has no facilities at all, the possibility of having a community facility is a big deal and we want to thank everyone who has supported the project to get it to its current status.

The oil-remediation initiative led by FCC at Blackdog Landfill site is now operational and we hope that the project will be successful in reducing the oil contamination of Blackdog beach which has been ongoing for some years.

We continue to review the feasibility of having a pedestrian bridge built over Blackdog burn to allow access to the beach for the young, the elderly and those of us who are less able. Trying to manage access up and down the sand dunes is tough going and has also resulted in damage to the dunes which are receding at a much faster pace. We need to move this project on, and we are now working with a new survey company in an attempt to secure the funding to support future activities within this project.

We have engaged, and met onsite, a supplier of playpark equipment to quote prices for new units for the Children's Play Park. The idea would be to replace less-used redundant equipment with new items.

Aberdeenshire Council have also indicated that they have plans to replace the multi-play unit in the park by early 2024. This is good news, and we will monitor this activity to ensure a successful completion.

Belhelvie Community Council kindly donated and installed three benches in the village which have been strategically placed on routes where people can rest when out for their daily exercise. We have also received two further benches, supported by funding from Aberdeen Propellor Funds, which we hope to have installed on the grass verge beside the Vattenfall operation. This cannot happen until the verges have been maintained, as they are overgrown and unmanageable in their current state. We have engaged Vattenfall operations for their support to have this work completed soon.

The Blackdog Residents Association (BRA) Committee worked tirelessly to plan and coordinate the Blackdog Gala which was held in the Community Park on Saturday 19th August. A delayed start due to a morning of heavy rain led to warm and sunny weather for our event, albeit with windy gusts that challenged our gazebo raising skills at times!

There was an excellent attendance at the event and everyone enjoyed the various stalls and activities available throughout the afternoon. Bouncy Castles, Mr Bubbles, Various Races for All Ages, Tug O' War, Beat the Goalie and many other activities were available for all, and this was supported by Tombola, Face-Painting and Craft Stalls along with a variety of goodies for sale. The hot food stall was ably manned by Chef Jeremy and the compliments for the quality of the burgers and sausages were abundant, both during and after the event!

Our thanks go to everyone who supported the Gala, either through donations of Tombola prizes or home bakes, or by volunteering throughout the day to help set up the equipment, man the stalls, and tidy up afterwards. Your generosity knows no bounds and your support is the reason that we had such a successful day. Our thanks also go to Joni from the Sand Bothy in Balmedie for supporting us with additional equipment and to Sharon and Graeme from Butterywells Farm for helping us get the equipment to and from Balmedie.

Finally, to our sponsors Augean North Sea Services, Kirkwood Homes and Archer Marketing, we owe you so much gratitude for your support for the Gala. Your funding and support ensured



that, again this year, we were able to supply all the children's activities free of charge, which is so gratefully appreciated by all.

At all our events we have been successful in raising funds for the community and it has allowed us the opportunity to start to buy equipment to support future activities. Purchases of gazebos, tables, lights, hot plates etc. will all be useful additions to our inventory, as well as acquiring a new noticeboard (see left) at the Community Park. We will have two events in the final quarter of 2023 - A Christmas get-together in the Community Park for the children, with the switching on of the Christmas tree lights, and an official Christmas Raffle. POTTERTON VOLUNTEERS

Potterton Volunteers met seven times throughout the Spring/Summer months this year, with its main area of activity being in the parkland adjacent to the Potterton Burn. We try to meet fortnightly, but weather and commitments don't always allow this. Our objective in this area is to make it a pleasant place for local people to enjoy with a wide diversity of trees, plants, and shrubs. So, the following tasks were undertaken:

- Keeping the burn flowing by removing algae, and controlling weed growth along the burn banks.
- Planting wildflowers, perennials, fruit trees and bushes (apple and plum trees, blackberry, red berry and gooseberry bushes), the plants being provided by Belhelvie Community Trust and the local Council's 'Perennials for Pollinators' programme.
- General housekeeping: keeping paths weed-free, strimming areas not addressed by the Local Council e.g., around park benches, picnic tables etc.
- Installation of an IBC (Internal Barrier Container). This has given us a 1000 litre
 water supply to assist in watering new plants. June was a particularly hot and
 dry month and some new plants suffered. The IBC was filled from the Black Dog
 burn using an electric pump.
- Digging out a flower bed running parallel to Panmure Gardens and planting out flowering plants and evergreen/deciduous flowering shrubs. Thanks go to Christiane for doing most of this work, with some assistance from Neil on the heavy digging.
- Maintaining and replanting the tubs, not only in the Potterton Burn area but around the village, this work being done by Hilary and Shuna.

It was great to see that our wildflower planting campaign had started to show some results, as had our efforts to restrict the Willow Herb growth in the area.



Future Projects for Potterton Volunteers

- Installation of a Willow Arbour & Seat (we are awaiting the outcome of a funding application).
- Installation of a 'Big Bug Hotel' hopefully with assistance from the local Scouting/Cub group.
- Solar lighting for the path Longer Term Project, Bernard Humphrey to research funding.

We meet at the Potterton Burn every two weeks from 11:00 until 13:00 (weather permitting!) mainly in the Spring and Summer, although we will have a Spring bulb planting day in October. We are always on the look out for volunteers. Keep an eye on the Potterton Volunteers Facebook page for details of when we are meeting. You would be very welcome to join us.





A WORD FROM THE DOC...

Making Choices

We live in a world which has a bewildering amount of choice. I am sure that some of you, like me, can remember when we only had three television channels, now there are over one

hundred available on free to air or satellite, and more through the streaming companies. By the time you have waded through the various menus, you find that you've spent ages just trying to find something to watch! Wide choice extends in many other areas such as clothing, food, drink and even colours to paint your home. Extensive choice is part of modern life, and something that we take for granted and feel is our right, even when it feels it makes life more complicated than it needs to be! To a certain extent, this is beginning to happen in health too.

Through the internet and by watching many of the aforementioned TV channels there is a huge amount of information and advice available to assist health choices. Some of these are little more than a vehicle to sell you something or highlight the transformative effect of cosmetic surgery. However, there are useful programmes too - for example, giving information on the harmful effects of ultra-processed foods.

With all this choice and availability of information it can be difficult to be certain that any claims made, or that the effectiveness of the treatments mentioned, are backed by rigorous research. I have been struck by the large increase in patients going abroad to have surgery done, particularly for more 'cosmetic' reasons, and worry that the long-term effects of exerting this choice are not known. This is in addition to the extra workload that is faced by primary care teams and our hospital colleagues when there are complications after they return home.

When making choices about our health, we need sound, impartial advice. This is what doctors and other health professionals strive to give, and where appropriate we try and explain choices available to a patient. This, in the case of a GP, means that there has been a minimum of ten years of education and training, with a rigorous external examination, the MRCGP, as an assessment which ensures that a minimum standard is met. This might not be the case for those performing some treatments, for example cosmetic Botox injections.

When you want to buy a car, you can make an informed choice by using various online sources or car magazines, to assess performance, economy, and details such as safety features. You can even take a test drive before you buy to help you decide. Information is not so easily available when thinking about a surgical procedure or a medical treatment.

GPs realise that patients' decisions can be influenced by their own experiences and by those of friends and family. I am often asked by patients to prescribe the same pill that a friend or neighbour got, because they feel better, even when the patient themselves does not have the same condition, or indeed the pill itself could be harmful to them!



Unless you can take a course in medical statistics, or start reading

medical journals, it is difficult to get the tools to allow a fully informed choice on medical treatments and interventions. That is why trained professionals such as your Community Pharmacist, Advanced Nurse Practitioner, or GP are usually a more dependable source of reliable advice to help guide health choices.

NHS Inform, as I have said before, is a good place to start online, and there are other sites such as the Patients Association website or MedlinePlus which are recognised as having a good reputation for providing reliable information.

Ultimately, the best choice you can make is to make sure you take responsibility for your health and try your best to minimise any contact with the NHS. I recommend choosing to be as active as you can be, eat as best as you can and try and be aware of how to get better information for your health choices.

Good health can be helped by choosing to avoid known harms, such as ultraprocessed foods, smoking and drinking too much. Choosing these options will give yourself a better chance of longer lasting good health. By reading information from reputable sources, you give yourself the tools to understand claims made about a 'superfood' or the latest health supplement being advertised.

Choice is a good thing, and informed choice is even better. Finally, remember to get your annual flu vaccine and if eligible your covid vaccine too. As last year, please do not contact your GP practice, invites will come from the Health Board.




POWER TO YOUR PELVIC FLOOR

Who would think that the pelvic floor is so important? I am seeing more and more people with problems that I feel result from structural influences on this very important structure. The problems can be acute or chronic pain coupled with urinary or faecal incontinence, impotence, infertility and more. A very painful pregnancy condition with severe pubic and groin pain can cause real disability - and something can be done.

Muscles of the pelvic floor run from the tailbone to the pubic bone. They act as a hammock to support the bladder, uterus and bowel, control the muscles that close the anus, vagina and urethra, work with the abdominal and back muscles to stabilise and support our spine (helping us to stand up straight). They help with abdominal pressure when we are lifting and/or exercising. They also facilitate ejaculation, maintain erections, tighten the vagina and are involved in sexual pleasure.

Male or female pelvic floors can be weakened by pregnancy, constant sitting, childbirth, menopause, obesity, chronic coughing, straining with bowel motions, scar tissue, heavy lifting, no exercise, radiotherapy and surgery e.g. prostatectomy.




The pubic bones meet at the front of the pelvis with the sacroiliac joint at the back. Pubic bones rely on the hip muscles, the abdominals and the pelvic floor muscles for stability. The pelvis is often misaligned due to the whole pelvis being tilted more forward on one side. This affects back and front. These bones separate to allow baby's head out but after birth, the bones may not realign - massage techniques and pelvic balancing treatments, followed by stretching and/or strengthening.


The sacro-iliac joints transmit the weight of the body to the pelvic girdle, so the sacrum needs to be correctly positioned so that the coccyx/tailbone is in the correct position for those all-important pelvic floor attachments. Having a structural check is always a good idea!

As we can see, it is important for everyone to exercise their pelvic floors (except for the minority whose floors are too tight which we can talk about next time.) To obtain the best results, the basin needs to be held in correct alignment. When there are distortions, fascial restrictions or muscle spasms causing uneven 'pulls' on bones, the knock-on effects can be devastating.

These exercises should be part of your routine - like cleaning your teeth. They can be done sitting, standing or lying down. Breathe normally, keep everywhere else relaxed. Contract your pelvic floor before you sneeze, cough, or lift heavy weights.

Ladies and gentlemen, the muscles that we want to target first are the ones that stop you from farting. Imagine you are cracking nuts with your buttocks. Start with an imaginary walnut and work down to a peanut. Leave a few seconds between each contraction so allow the muscles to relax - just as you do when you work-out.





MEN can identify their PF muscles by stopping the flow of urine when they go for a pee. Don't hold it and only do it once! This is just to let you feel where the muscles are. The exercise is tensing, squeezing and lifting. Look in the mirror and watch as your penis pulls back a bit and your scrotum rises. PF exercises pre and post prostate surgery will help your bladder regain its control.

LADIES: You too can identify the muscles that you clench when you are desperate. Now, imagine a pencil in your vaginatighten the muscles around it and then bend your knees and using your hips write the alphabet holding on to that imaginary pencil. This is a standing position but can be adapted. OR Imagine grapes in your vagina and squeeze from the base up to the top. Then rest. Then repeat. This is handier when you are in queues and can't wriggle about.

Osteopathy and **Remedial and Sports Massage** are the treatments of choice for imbalances and painful problems. Working on leg muscles helps ease the pain while at the same time helping to balance the pelvis. Osteopathic techniques may be required for the pubic and sacroiliac joints. These are gentle techniques and should help a great deal.




