



OPEN WATER SWIMMING The Bluetits Group



Watching the 'One Show', nearing the end of COVID restrictions, was when I first got into wild swimming. I watched as two women broke through ice on a river, and I immediately thought, I need to do this!

After some research, I found the Bluetits groups. They are a group of swimmers that started off in Wales and now have groups all over the world. Contacting the Bluetits HQ, I found out that there were no groups in the Northeast of Scotland so - would I be willing to start one?

In April 2021, I started the Aberdeen city group, which now has over 1,000 members and they usually swim at Fittie. Bev from Balmedie is the admin for that group now, as I have moved to Auchnagatt and started another group for North of Aberdeen. We mainly swim in Collieston, Cruden Bay and Peterhead Lido, but have been known to be 'Tits on Tour' and venture further afield for day trips to some amazing locations.

Balmedie residents are so lucky having access to so many fantastic beaches. Anyone is welcome to join the group, or all three groups (there is a south group for Stonehaven too). You can swim as often or as little as you like, you can swim or just have a dook. If you want to swim, you just post on Facebook and, more often than not, someone will keep you company. You can even just come along and join for the tea, chat and cake after if you aren't quite ready to take the plunge.

The groups are amazing. I've met so many incredible people along the way, from all walks of life and made some solid friendships through swimming with them. We are also incredibly lucky to have an amazing swim coach, Paula from Adelie Penguins Open Water Swim Coaching (see Facebook). Paula holds sessions for anyone interested in open water swimming and is a little nervous to try it. She'll show you what to look for before you get in the water, and you will have some sessions in the water to help build confidence. Paula's sessions concentrate on learning safety, what you need to get started, and how to get warm after your swims. Paula can also do more advanced lessons too, I've always wanted to learn how to do heads down swimming and with some sessions with Paula, I'm on my way to learning front crawl at 49 years old.

A few of the 'Baltic Bluetits fae Aberdeenshire North' have signed up to swim at an event in Loch Morlich in September. We are swimming 750m to help raise money for Teenage Cancer Trust, amazing to think we just started as 'dookers'!

When I first started wild swimming, I wasn't aware of all the health or social benefits. Now after swimming for two years and researching a little, I can now appreciate the benefits. Apart from socially and the friendship groups that form, I've heard many members talk about how pain free (from the likes of arthritis) they are after starting swimming in the cold water.

Many of the 'flock' swim for their mental health, I'm currently in the throes of perimenopause, my anxiety was high, and moods were variable to say the least! But the sanity and calm felt as soon as you immerse yourself in the water was just the small escapism that my body needed to reset and as I walk out of the water after my swim, I feel ready to face life again. Some members have mentioned that wild swimming is helping their Reynaud's, giving them a sense of community and a form of exercise they enjoy, easing symptoms of fibromyalgia, giving them some 'me time' from a busy family life, helping with hip pain... the list goes on!

We have some themed swims over the summer, coffee, cake and road trips are all part of the experience and this also forms bonds between group members and elevates low mood and loneliness. I've yet to hear a negative comment!

Swimming in the open water is just so freeing and for me nostalgic. I feel totally at ease with the world. Looking out to the horizon is very humbling and puts things into perspective, it's the same with river swims and seeing the mountains surrounding you. It really makes you feel like you are totally immersed in nature.

When swimming on my own, it gives me time for my brain to reset and help me deal with life as it starts to appear as I emerge from the water. When swimming with the Bluetits, it's about being part of a community - laughter, chatting, camaraderie and meeting people from different walks in life. No-one is judged, everyone is accepted.

It's coming up to the perfect time to start Open Water swimming. The water is starting to get warmer (it's at its coldest in March and warmest in September). If anyone fancies trying OWS you can find all three of our groups on Facebook. Feel free to join any of the groups and swims - all are welcome!

AFTER-SCHOOL CLUB AXED

Back in February, Aberdeenshire Council voted (11 to 6) in favour of stopping the authority's out-of-school care provision (After School Clubs). The Council has been running eight facilities across the region, providing somewhere for children to spend the time while their parents remain at work. The Council argued that it could no longer afford to keep the services going. Anxious parents had six months to seek alternative care. Some worried that they would have to give up working if an alternative was not found. In the Belhelvie Parish area, we have some excellent child-minders, but they can only provide a service for a limited number of children.

It was fortunate that a solution was found, in the form of 'Kids Academy', the brainchild of Shona Grant, who introduces herself, and her service below. You can also have a look at the **Kids Academy Out of School Club** Facebook page to find out more.

NEW CHILDCARE OPTIONS IN THE BALMEDIE AREA



Families across Aberdeenshire have always faced challenges in sourcing affordable and sustainable childcare for primary school aged children. Aberdeenshire Council have provided an out-ofschool club service in several towns across the 'shire. However, these clubs mostly run at capacity, leaving many parents on a waiting list to secure spaces for their children.

I found myself in this situation in 2014, when I returned to work after having my youngest child. I got in touch with Ellon out-of-school club only to be informed that they had over a 2-year waiting list. At a loss, as to how I could continue in my role, I decided to research the possibility of setting up a new club.

This could solve my childcare problems and help many other families. I have 5 children and, when they were very young, I was a stay-at-home mum. I was very involved in the local play group and was chairperson of the committee there for many years. When the Play Group was threatened with closure, due to no applications for the position of manager, I decided to take on this role myself. During this time, I completed the qualification SVQ level 3 Childcare learning and development and gained 5 years' experience in managing a childcare setting.

Kids Academy out-of-school club opened in April 2016, based in Ellon Academy community campus. My club started out small, which was great as it gave us the ability to build good relationships with the children and parents. We are currently registered to have 40 children at both breakfast and after-school clubs and are now running at capacity with a waiting list in place.

When Aberdeenshire Council recently announced the closure of out-of-school clubs across Aberdeenshire, I was inundated with requests for spaces at Kids Academy, which I unfortunately could not fulfil. Several parents got in touch suggesting that I expand my service. After much deliberation I decided to open additional services in Balmedie and in Ellon. The Balmedie setting will be based in Balmedie Primary while the additional setting in Ellon will be based in Auchterellon Primary.

We are currently in the process of registering both services with the Care Inspectorate and are hopeful of opening both services in August for the schools going back. We hope to provide as much continuity as possible for the children who currently attend these settings.

We will be providing breakfast club from 7.00 and after-school club until 18.00, both settings will be registered for 40 places. If you would like further information or wish to register a place for your child, do get in touch.

POTTERTON COMMUNITY ACTION PLAN

At the start of 2024, members of Potterton Community formed a steering group to undertake a Community Action Plan (CAP). The CAP is a great opportunity to make changes and improvements to your community. Over the past couple of months, the Steering Group have been collecting the thoughts and comments from Potterton residents on changes and improvements that can be made in the village. Many thanks to the many members of the community who completed the survey and came along to the coffee mornings. These responses have given valuable insight to inform the next stage of the CAP process.

A CAP is a participatory process that can build the skills and capacity of a community. It is when people get involved to take action to address their needs, any issues and develop the potential of where they live and work. It provides a framework for implementing positive change by identifying and specifying WHAT will be done, WHO might be involved and HOW it will be done.



The action plan will have a lifespan of 3-5 years. To help identify the community's priorities and what actions to focus on for this plan, the steering group will be holding a drop-in event at Potterton Community Centre in the next couple of months where residents will be able to see the results of the consultation and have their say on the emerging themes.



BELHELVIE PARISH RESILIENCE GROUP

Over the last 6 months some of your local community groups and residents of the community, have come together to create **Belhelvie Parish Resilience Group**. In times of crisis, it is important for our communities to come together to support one another. It is crucial for us to be prepared for any potential emergencies that may arise during a bad weather crisis.

The recent establishment of our community resilience group aims to enhance communication between our communities and local authorities, and to provide vital information about community hubs and services that will be available during a bad weather crisis. We have set up a new Facebook page with the intention of posting all relevant and up to date guidance from local authorities, emergency responders, energy suppliers and our own community services. Please find us on Facebook: **Community Resilience in Belhelvie Parish**.



We want to emphasise the importance of being self-sufficient for at least 72 hours during a bad weather crisis. If an emergency happens in your community, it may take the emergency services some time to reach you. This is because they may need to help other, more vulnerable people first. You should be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for up to 72 hours. By looking after yourself and your household, you will also be helping emergency services focus their limited resources on the people who are most in need.

Make a plan - and don't forget neighbours can help by sharing resources, such as gas for camping stoves or food supplies. You should have food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dry food. During some emergencies, some water sources can become contaminated. Have a back-up supply of bottled water available.

Preparedness is key, and it is essential for each household to have their own plan in place to effectively navigate through challenging circumstances. You can find links to templates of such plans on our new Facebook page and also at: <u>www.ssen.co.uk</u> (Your Home Emergency Plan). In addition to individual preparedness, our community resilience group will be disseminating information about community hubs that will serve as warm spaces for resources, hot drinks, and assistance during a crisis. Soon, we hope to provide you with a list of local services that will be available. Please keep an eye on our new Facebook page as well as community notice boards for further updates. Stay safe.

As we all know, the village is growing with all the new homes, so we are keen to make sure there is equitable representation from all areas. For those that have recently moved to the village, we also have our residents' association FaceBook page, so search **Blackdog Community Group** for up-to-date information.

Since the last edition of the Banter, the community have been out in force, making the village a better place for us all to live in. The autumn planting day saw the team of volunteers plant over 1,000 bulbs around the village which are due to flower this Spring, so look out for some new flashes of colour this year. Thank you to Elaine, from the committee for being so green fingered and arranging the logistics of the day. These planting days happen twice a year in the village so look out for the next one. The Council provide the bulbs every year, which is great to see as given the funding cuts we know how difficult it is to provide anything for the village.

The annual Christmas tree light and carol ceremony took place again in December. Thank you to Ellon Local Vocals who braved the cold to sing to us all. Moyra was also on hand with her special brew of Mulled Wine to keep us all warm. The kids were well-entertained, and they all got a gift from Santa's elves as I am sure they were all very well behaved throughout the year.



We had our Christmas raffle which was well supported with donations and ticket sales. The winning tickets were drawn by Butterywells Farms and all prizes were distributed around Christmas. On a personal note, I watched in horror as I won a jigsaw and then spent the rest of Christmas trying to complete it, only for our dog to eat the last piece! We raised over £2,500 which is needed to allow us to continue our work, so a huge thank you for all your support.

We have continued with our village and beach litter picks throughout the period. The storms were particularly devastating with lots of debris being blown onto the beach. We were assisted by East Grampian Coastal Partnership on two clean-ups where over 50 bags of rubbish were collected and sent to the Council for recycling. The more volunteers we get, the more litter we can collect, so do make an effort next time we advertise a litter pick. Dog-fouling continues to be an issue in the village so please pick up



after your pooch and put the bag in the bin too. Behind the scenes we continue to push ahead with our Community Centre, new play park equipment, beach bridge and various benches around the village. Progress is sometimes slow, but we are moving forward, so keep an eye out for our updates on these major projects.

On the Community Centre, the consultants are making good progress and are arranging another community engagement event to showcase Stage 2 of the design. We are also working with Kirkwood Homes and the Council to ascertain when the land will be transferred.

For the play park equipment, the Council have unfortunately delayed this project until sometime later in the year which is disappointing. The committee continue to put pressure on the Council to progress this.



The bridge has now progressed to the structural design phase with a surveyor being appointed to perform the ground investigation works. Funding from Vattenfall has been secured to cover these expenses. We are also progressing with installation of benches on the path down to the beach to improve

the access and attractiveness of the path. We hope this will encourage people to use the path rather than the road to improve safety.

We look forward to planning our BBQ Fun Day on 10th August, so get your shorts looked out! More information will be available nearer the time.

provision is managed and delivered by the Balmedie Leisure Centre Association SCIO, a not-for-profit charitable organisation which was set up in 1986.

We work in partnership with Middlefield Wasps who operate and maintain the grass pitches, but the overall running of the centre and football provision is overseen by a management committee which is made up of local volunteers and members from most of the groups which are in operation at the centre.

We employ full and part-time staff who manage and run the centre and coffee shop on a day-to-day basis. We rely on volunteers, and income from rentals, activities and fundraising to keep it afloat. In an average week, we regularly welcome more than 2,500 children and adults into the building. It is a valuable resource within our community, please come along and have a look.

They all wanted to do something special to commemorate what would have been her 40th birthday so they borrowed a Sandcruiser chair and went to the water's edge. Although so sad, we were delighted to help to make such wonderful memories for them.

Not every chair goes out for such powerful reasons as this, but many have a story to tell. Without these types of chairs, access to something as reasonable as getting to the water's edge with your family, for special moments, or simply to get your toes wet, can be a real issue. We are delighted to add another two chairs this year which means we can cover more needs and host larger groups. The bookings are now coming in and it's going to be an exciting year!



In March we participated in the Volunteers' Open Day at the Sand Bothy as we are always looking for extra hands and now, we are delighted to be joined by another four willing volunteers. It's hard to believe that it is almost 10 years since the founders of Belhelvie Community Trust were offered a shell of a building, damaged by fire and vandalism, at Balmedie Country Park - the building we now know as The Sand Bothy. Within months we had been approved as a charity and the work began, with the Bothy opening on July 1st 2016.

Since then, the Bothy has become a fixture in our community and has literally weathered the storms thrown at it by the North Sea, and the hurdles put in our way by bureaucracy and the covid pandemic.

Over time, BCT has created and run Balmedie Beach Wheelchairs, Balmedie Sensory Garden, Potterton Volunteers, Balmedie Hub and Balmedie Litter Squad, plus giving support to other projects around the parish. We have our critics who ask why don't we do more? The simple answer is we have always tried to work according to our resources. We don't want to promise what we can't achieve. The only way we can expand now is if we have more volunteers and people prepared to take on projects in their own communities. I am therefore taking this opportunity to ask if you can help to keep BCT going? All sorts of people with all sorts of interests and abilities can join our team. Volunteering is fulfilling and fun!

We carried out a Consultation in 2023. Throughout the parish, a wide range of issues was important to residents. Some of these would require considerable input from Council, Health and Transport providers, but there are other projects which could be community led. We will be examining these in more detail to determine if they could be provided by the community - more about this in the next issue of Belhelvie Banter.

A WORD FROM THE DOC...

Reflections

This year, on the first of February, marked thirty years since I started as a GP at Scotstown. I can scarcely believe that three decades have

passed since I was a young loon (with hair!), looking forward with a mix of excitement and trepidation to my first day. Not surprisingly, this has made me pause and reflect on thirty years of working as a GP and how things are now compared to last century!

In 1994 our practice, like most GPs, still did 'traditional' on call, and we had no mobile phones. I had a bleep and a stack of 10p coins to use in phone boxes when the bleep went off. My home phone would ring when people needed to be seen out of hours, and my wife had to be at home to answer the phone and set off the bleep when I was out and about. Effectively the whole family was on call when I was. Now this is covered by NHS 24 and GMed.

The biggest change, I feel, is the sheer volume of work that faces every practice, every day. Sadly, there are many less GPs around to share the workload, there may be more GPs by 'head count' but GP numbers as 'whole time equivalent' has seen a significant fall. I routinely speak to or see roughly 50 to 60 people every day but often many more. This does not include the time and further contacts generated from making referrals, reading hospital clinic letters, reviewing blood tests and reports from other investigations as well as signing hundreds of repeat prescriptions. This contrasts with a daily total of about 36 people seen when I started, with lower volumes of subsequent work resulting. The British Medical Association and the European Union advise that each GP should have only 25 contacts per day. Most GP practices now have a mix of more phone or electronic appointments with longer face to face appointments to try and be as efficient as possible, to cope with the huge demand.

An unappreciated area of additional workload is from medical reports to insurance companies, the DVLA, occupational health colleagues and many other people acting on behalf of patients. If a patients' lawyer asks for copies of their medical records, GPs must spend valuable time carefully checking them to make sure there is no third-party confidentiality breech. We must do this free of charge despite considerable cost, particularly in time, to the practice. We must also provide care to people from outwith the UK free of charge.

All this makes the job much more demanding and at times frustrating, but I am still glad to be a GP. Medical students and young doctors are increasingly put off the career I chose when they become aware of the workload, and the very public nature of working in primary care.

A huge feature in recent years has been the rise of social media and for most patients, instant access to 'Dr Google', which, I have no doubt, increases workload as there is more anxiety generated about possible causes for symptoms experienced.



A significant concern is that mental health resilience is, for some, undermined by the unforgiving nature of social media interactions. So why am I still glad to be a GP given the huge workload challenges and the potential for vilification on Facebook? Quite simply, it is a great privilege to be a GP and to work with patients over many years to try and help them with their health problems.

What I mean by privilege is that there are few jobs where you get to meet people on their best days, for example when they share that they are happily expecting a baby, or just come in to tell you that they have been accepted for university and to thank you for the support you have given in past years. Then there are the worst days, when you must tell someone that they will not recover from their illness, or you visit to provide palliative care. These highs and lows and the doctor patient relationship are what makes the job so rewarding and a privilege to do.

I have been a GP trainer for most of my career, helping younger doctors become GPs, which has also been a very rewarding and occasionally challenging role. The area many trainees struggle with is the uncertainty of our job. We cannot test, scan, or admit everybody we see, even though there is an increasing demand for such interventions. Our role is to help explain and build understanding as to why tests are not necessary at a particular time. This is an essential role that the GP has, which helps to protect people from over medicalisation and indeed stop the NHS going bankrupt! The opposite of this is of being able to realise when action is needed. This is a career-long and never fully-mastered art, but one which we keep working at through what we call reflective practice.

This means that we try to learn from cases, and each other. We, as practice teams, think about what has been done to and for patients and how we can pass on good aspects of care to others and improve where needed. This needs time and is a very important aspect for all health professionals but is increasingly squeezed by demand. I do feel that it is important to realise that good primary care needs time to teach, reflect, and learn from one another and experts so that we have the best tools to help our patients.

To everyone who reads this who is registered at Scotstown Medical Group, I would like to thank you for thirty rewarding years, and I hope I have been able to be of help when asked. I still have a few years to go before I can hang up my stethoscope, and I am sure you will all keep active (you'd be disappointed if I didn't do my usual nagging!), eat well and try your best to stay away from having to see your primary care team!



ABERDEENSHIRE COUNCIL NEWS



Aberdeenshire Council - General Enquiries 03456 08 12 08 Councillor Andrew Hassan shares some news:

As I write this during the Easter recess fortnight, I hope all constituents have been able to enjoy a restful time. There are a few things I'd like to remind you of:

The Formartine Area Committee Fund opened for 2024/25 in March - the sum for the year totalled £94,404. During 2023/24, funding was provided for a Seasonal Formartine Ranger, Balmedie Leisure Centre's ASN equipment, and for the improvement of the Balmedie Football Pavilion Car Park. Blackdog received funding towards the design and planning stage of the new Community Facility planned for the village.

The **Formartine Area Recognition Scheme** is now in full operation. Suggestions for recognition are welcome of anyone who has contributed significantly to their community - either over a long period of time, or a one-off event. The Formartine Area Committee would then assess the application and determine if the honour should be bestowed.

Visitors to **Balmedie Country Park** may have come across the permanent Formartine Ranger David Brown who has become a well-known face. Sadly, he has decided to retire from the post and we all wish him well with much thanks for his many years of work. Recruitment is currently underway to appoint a successor.

Road Matters continue to fill my mailbox. I have continued to lobby both the roads team, and Police Scotland on speeding concerns along Old Road, Balmedie which is regularly raised with me. We also continue to liaise to find a solution to the long-standing pedestrian crossing concerns on Eigie Road. In the Autumn, a pedestrian survey was carried out by the road safety team to try and establish a safe crossing point. Unfortunately, Councillors were notified that the criteria were not met for a crossing. We would welcome community feedback on this outcome. I will continue dialogue with the school parents who first raised the issue with me.

Through dialogue with Graeme Fyvie, Formartine's new Community Waste Officer, the Council have managed to secure funding to get a dog waste bin for the area beside the bus stop adjacent to Rowan Drive. I hope this resolves the issue of dog mess to the south of the village.

Finally, the matter of addressing HGV traffic going through Milton of Potterton is progressing. Following a lengthy and detailed discussion at Formartine Area Committee we progressed the topic onto what is referred to as the **Committee Review Process**. The next stage of this is scheduled for 23rd April when we will be having a workshop with officers, Police Scotland and Belhelvie Community Council to discuss residents' concerns about heavy traffic in the area.

Away from formal meetings, your local Councillors continue to get lobbied on several matters locally in all the settlements that make up the Belhelvie Parish - and are happy to hear from constituents at any time. We also regularly attend the Belhelvie Community Council meetings.
